A Voting membership cannot be credited against the fee for any other rate of membership.

Art Show update

Although there's still some time to go before Danse Macabre tangoes into our lives, here's some further news about our plans and actions.

First, money. After discussion with the estimable Margaret Hilliard (organiser, Conviction Art Show), the Committee has decided that the commission rate for artwork sold at Danse Macabre will remain at the standard 10 percent of the sale price.

Second, Art Show layout. There will be at least one lockable cabinet set up in the gallery to display jewellery and other small 3-D pieces. Paintings, drawings, etc will be displayed on movable display boards. You may have to organise the placement of LARGE items directly with me

Third, transport and security. Procedures to handle transport of items, and their security when not at the Convention hotel, are being worked out. At the Convention itself, the artwork will be displayed in a secure area close to the main convention facilities.

Fourth, advertising. The Danse Macabre Art Show will be advertised on student notice-boards around the Melbourne area (and as many other cities/towns as we can get access to) in the second half of this year. If you want to help out with this placement, please drop me a line (two fathoms long), care of the Convention address.

Fifth, ideas for 'theme' art. A couple of suggestions made to me about this:

- New designs for decks of cards.
- Paintings on mirrors (small ones, I'd imagine) and other items like marbles, glasses, etc.

More Art Show news will be provided in later issues of **BIZARRE**, but for now I think it's time to quickstep out of here. One two three...

Hucksters: There will be a separate Hucksters Room.

Daily Rates: Professional \$25.00 Fan

You also need an Attending or Day membership. Area allocation approximately 2 x 3 metres. If you have questions, please write.

Fan Lounge and Party Suite: There will be a Fan Lounge in the Diplomat and a Party Suite in the Spaceline, where members can go to sit and talk, rest, or think.

Art Show: See separate Artshow report. If you have any suggestions, send them to: Dennis Callegari, 22 Waltham Street, Richmond 3121.

Ditmars: The 1990 Australian SF Achievement Awards will be voted on by Danse Macabre members before and during the con. Nomination forms will be distributed to all members, and also to fandom generally, later this year. Remember that anyone may nominate for the Ditmars but that you must be a member of Danse Macabre to vote. Details in a later issue.

1992 Site Selection: The site for the 1992 Australian SF Convention will be decided at a meeting to be held at Danse Macabre. Groups interested in bidding for the right to hold the 1992 Natcon should contact us before the start of Danse Macabre. As with the Ditmars, you must be a member of Danse Macabre to vote on Site Selection.

Program Book Cover: Unlike Conspiracy, the British Worldcon that trusted their sponsors to produce a cover for their Program Book, we'd like to see our cover before the printing deadline comes around. But more than that, we want to see your idea of a good cover for a science fiction convention's Program Book. So we're running a contest for it. Interested? Scratch up a design and try it!

The Human Orrery: May be constructed in a nearby park one day of the Con. If interested in taking part, please drop us a line and tell us what chunk of solar-systemnal rock you prefer to be.

Creche: There will be no creche organised by the Con, but we will help you contact other members wanting a creche, so that you can form mutual support groups.

• Negotiations are under way with respect to an official Convention Airline. Now is the time for people intending to fly to Melbourne to start thinking about group bookings. More news as soon as it becomes available.

Weapons Policy: Put baldly: no exposed edged weapons, no projectile weapons. See also: Code of Behaviour: Individuals engaging in unacceptable behaviour may be expelled from the Con without refund of membership. At discretion of Committee, membership fee may be refunded and any individual expelled with or without reason being stated.

Smoking: Only in the lobby adjacent to function rooms at rear of the Diplomat. Note that this is a slight amendment to policy listed last issue.

Swancon 14, with an 'urban spaceman' theme, ran over the Easter break from Thursday afternoon to an official finish about 5pm Monday, with a kick-on Dead Dog Party later that night.

Con Hotel was the Kings Ambassador in central Perth, and the staff were helpful and courteous. Concommittee managed unauthorised parties well and as far as I know there were no major hassles. [NB: Parties were all supposed to be held on the 4th Floor. Some parties were not. These were thus 'unauthorised'. GRH]

Function rooms were fairly close together in the Basement, with central registration, bar and fan lounge to one side, and two programme halls plus Hucksters Room all on this level. A video room was on the 4th Floor and a games/Art Show room on the 3rd, both close to the lifts, of which only one accessed the Basement.

Enetertaining moments of the Con include Bob Shaw's 'Serious Science' talk as well as his after-dinner speech. The masked ball saw lots of costumes, masks, and fun. I missed the Thursday night Fandance due to a Rail Baron heat.

Meeting Grant Stone was one highlight of the con. Apart from the fact that he liked GET STUFFED, he seems full of energy and enthusiasm for fandom & sf. Mark Linneman and myself 'pied' him on the Monday. We had planned to cut the pie into six pieces, one for each Ditmar, but its construction from unset raspberry jelly and 'instant' whipped cream precluded that.

Speaking of Ditmars, it was a clean sweep to Melbourne this year, apart from International Fiction. I think there were 68 valid votes received, well up on last year.

The awards this year were made from polished zebra stone (found only in WA and South Africa), mounted on a wooden plinth. Two small plaques were attached [to the plinth] -- one for the category and winner's name, the other with 'Aust. SF Achievement Award' and Southern Cross which looked like an Air Mail sticker. Tw spare pieces of zebra stone were mounted and presented to John Varley and Bob Shaw. Apparently the fine white/black type of the stone is now under Lake Argyle and unavailable. (The awards also turned out to be suitable for GET STUFFED reason #19 Why We Want A Ditmar -- 'To shove down my trousers to impress the girls', as joint acceptor Danny Heap demonstrated during the ceremony.

The Ditmar Award ceremony was taped and broadcast on Grant Stone's radio show Thursday morning, much to the surprise of Gina Goddard who was changing TV channels

at the time and discovered it could pick up the local radio station by recognising Ian Nicholls' voice!

John Varley's GoH speech was pretty serious and dealt with Salman Rushdie and Free Speech. Paul Stevens spoke of past incidents and fannish anecdotes after the banquet (his talk was moved back from Saturday as he had to work at Myers).

Relaxed pool and sauna parties marked most nights. Earnest discussion while eating & drinking seemed to pass lots of time. Some parties were livened up by the 'rinky-dinky-plop-plop-zoop-zoop-whee' fannish handshake being transferred to WA fandom.

About 50 people attended the Dead Dog party which raged at the Turkich residence on Monday night.

Generally there was a lot of catching up with old friends and getting to know people, particularly overseas visitors like the Harveys, Lynn-Anne & Roelof (GUFF), John Berry & Eileen Gunn(?) (DUFF) and Brian Howell (FFANZ), many of whom will be visiting Melbourne & Sydney during their trips.

This Swancon was definitely a success and enjoyable; now to plan to attend a future one sometime.
