Bruce Sterling is the author of nine novels, three of which were selected as New York Times Notable Books of the Year. The Difference Engine, cowritten with William



Gibson, was a national bestseller. He has also published three short-story collections and one nonfiction book, The Hacker Crackdown.

He edited the anthology Mirrorshades and has written for many magazines, including Newsweek, Time, Fortune, Harper's, Details, Whole Earth Review, Technology Review, Dwell, Frieze, World Art, and Wired, where he has been a contributing writer since its conception. In 1999, he won the Hugo Award in the short-story category. He recently wrote introductions to two books by Jules Verne.

He lives in Austin, Texas but has been known to answer email from cybercafes in Vienna, Valencia, Amsterdam, San Francisco, Seattle, and Dubrovnik.



Science Guest of Honor Ron Westrum

Ron Westrum is Professor of Sociology and Interdisciplinary Technology at Eastern Michigan University, where he has taught for 31 years. A maverick sociologist, Prof. Westrum has specialized in the sociology of science, technology, innovation, and safety. Dr. Westrum's education took place at Ann Arbor High (1963), Harvard (cum laude 1966), and the University of Chicago (Ph.D 1972 Sociology).

After receiving his doctorate, he joined

the Sociology Department at Eastern Michigan University and has continued to teach there, with visiting appointments at the University of Edinburgh and the University of Hawaii. His earliest studies were on the sociology of anomalies, including UFOs, sea-serpents, and ball lightning. About a dozen papers were written on the psychology of sightings, the sociology of reporting, and etc. A plenary lecture was given to the Meteoritical Society on historical meteoritics. He has been a long-time consultant to the Mutual UFO Network in sociology. He started, but never finished, a book on "hidden events," things that are not supposed to happen but apparently do!

Later studies focused on technology and particularly safety (aviation, nuclear, medical). Best known for his work with the aviation community and its corporate cultures, he has also consulted for a number of large and small technology-oriented organizations, such as NASA, General Motors and Lockheed Martin. He carried out a study of the Naval Weapons Center, published as a book by the Naval Institute Press: Sidewinder: Creative Weapons Development at China Lake (1999). This book, now in its third printing, has been the subject of lectures at the Sorbonne and the Naval War College. A frequent speaker at international meetings on systems safety, his ideas on "pathological, bureaucratic, and generative" organizations have traveled around the world.

Dr. Westrum lives in Ann Arbor with his artist wife Deb and two children, Max and Piper. He collects old drafting sets and loves tinkering around in his woodshop.

Artist Guest of Honor Julie Bell

During the past eight years, a bright star has been rising on the firmament of science fiction/fantasy art.

In this short period, Julie Bell has established herself as a force to be reckoned with, rubbing elbows with the top luminaries of the art world.



Born in Beaumont, Texas, her art studies always centered around drawing, especially of the human figure. Her unique sense of color and dramatic composition puts her paintings in a class by themselves. Her, by now, legendary "metal flesh" has the fluency of water and the hardness of steel while maintaining the sensual softness of the skin. This magical effect has become her unmistakable trademark.

A former competitive bodybuilder, Julie applies the same discipline and intensity to her art career. At the heart of her art is an element of empowerment and independence.

Collections of her paintings have appeared in book form, calendars, posters, trading cards, and other products too numerous to mention.

Mine has a small pile of paper notes and a crossword puzzle book. Ah, well.)

She lives in a place called Toad Hall (OK, she's in the process of moving....talk to her about that too!) which is wondrous indeed.

But – all these things really don't tell you much about Geri. That's because Geri is a *person*, not a combination of the random bits of information about her. She's a one-in-a-million person at that.



Toastmaster Robert J. Sawyer

Robert J. Sawyer is the most recent winner of a best-novel Hugo Award, which he received at Torcon 3 for his novel *Hominids*, the first volume of the *Neanderthal Parallax* trilogy. The second volume, *Humans*, was a top-ten national mainstream bestseller in Canada (as was Rob's previous Hugo nominee, *Calculating God*, which in addition hit number-one on the Locus bestsellers' list). The concluding

volume, *Hybrids*, was published by Tor in hardcover in September 2003 ("A fine combination of love story, social commentary, and ecothriller closes a terrific series with a bang," says *Booklist*).

Rob is also the winner of a best-novel Nebula Award from the Science Fiction and Fantasy Writers of America for his *The Terminal Experiment*. Both *Hominids* and *The Terminal Experiment*, plus Sawyer's Hugo and Nebula Award-nominated *Starplex*, were serialized in *Analog*; Sawyer's latest short story in that magazine, "Shed Skin," appeared in the January/February 2004 issue.

Among Rob's other honors are eight Canadian Science Fiction and Fantasy Awards ("Auroras"); three Japanese Best-Foreign-Novel Seiun Awards (for *End of an Era*, *Frameshift*, and *Illegal Alien*); an Arthur Ellis Award from the Crime Writers of Canada; and the *Science Fiction Chronicle* Reader Award.

Tor has been aggressively reissuing Rob's older titles in trade paperback: *Golden Fleece* (which Orson Scott Card named the best SF novel of 1990), *End of an Era* (called "one of the most accomplished SF novels of the last 10 years" by the Canadian publishing trade journal *Quill* & *Quire*), and *Factoring Humanity* (named one of the year's top ten novels by authors of any nationality in any category by *The Ottawa Citizen*) are already out in that format; Rob's acclaimed *Quintaglio Ascension* trilogy is soon to follow, starting with *Far-Seer* in May 2004.

Rob lives in Mississauga, Ontario (just west of Toronto) with poet Carolyn Clink, his wife of 20 years. For more on Rob and his work, see his massive website (over one million words of text) at **www.sfwriter.com**.

Please wear your Con Badge in all convention function areas. We can't remember everyone's face. Any badge without a number is **NOT** a legitimate badge and will not be recognized as one. Please don't lend your badge to anyone. Doing so will get both you and your borrower asked to leave the convention **without** a refund.

Please notify the Convention Committee of any problems or concerns you may have about the convention. We can't provide a remedy if we don't know one is needed. On the flip side, please let us know what you liked and what you'd like to see added for next year. Come to th ConFusion Feedback Session on Sunday at 3 pm in Dennison I and II for your best opportunity to be heard.

Controlled and illegal substances - You know what could get you busted. So do we. So do the authorities. Do us all a favor and just **don't** go there. Because if you do, we won't follow or come get you.

The ConFusion Convention Committee reserves the right to expel you without a refund should you forget the common sense rules of respect, tolerance, and peaceful conditions for others attending the convention. **Don't make us have to**!

Michigan's minimum drinking age is 21. No exceptions will be made, so please don't ask, and please be understanding if we ask you to show your ID. Our consuite barkeeps also reserve the right to refuse to serve those who appear to have had enough, or too much.

Alcohol and room parties - If you're holding a room party, please make sure that you are not serving alcohol to anyone under 21. This includes minors serving themselves. Any party found to be serving to minors, or letting them serve themselves will be closed down immediately. **No exceptions.** And please, no "roaming" beverages below the hotel's second floor. **Drinking and Driving** - Michigan has a very tough drinking-and-driving law. Anyone pulled over for driving while intoxicated who fails or refuses to submit to a breathalyzer test will have his or her license cut up. A temporary permit will be issued, good for 77 days or until the case is resolved in court. If you are convicted of DWI the law requires a six-month suspension of your license, and you will not be able to get a limited driving license at all for the first 30 days. There are also much heavier penalties for subsequent convictions and accidents when the driver is under the influence of alcohol.

Please Don't Drink and Drive!

Weapons Policy

ConFusion recognizes that weapons can be the finishing touches on many costumes. In order to allow fans to continue this tradition, we ask that all weapons, of any kind, be peacebonded. Come to Operations to get red yarn to mark your peacebonded weapon - if you say you won't draw your weapon, we're prepared to believe you. However... ConFusion's policy is: If it looks like a real weapon, it IS a real weapon. Real or realistic looking firearms are **NOT** permitted even if peacebonded. A blade longer than 3 inches is illegal too, but will be allowed in the convention's function space as part of a costume if peacebonded. No one should use a weapon - sword, staff, martial arts device, or whatever - for anything but leaning on. If a convention attendee annoys, frightens, or fights with others, the Con reserves the right to eject that attendee without refund of membership. If you want to show your support of the option of peacebonding you're invited to stop by Operations and get your Con Badge peacebonded!

BDSM Policy

Similarly, ConFusion recognizes that many fans enjoy the opportunity to flaunt their leather, lace, and PVC in their costuming activities. However, please keep in mind that "Safe, Sane, and Consensual" includes bystanders. Other convention members did not consent to see you flogging your partner in the hallway. For this reason, we will be peacebonding all BDSM implements with purple string. Please come to Operations to show your support and have your floggers, cats, and crops peace-bonded. What you do with them in your hotel room is up to you (as long as you don't bind your toys to the sprinkler system), but please refrain from demonstrating in function space.

Volunteer Corps

Confusion is run entirely by an army of volunteers. Why don't you join us, and find out just how much fun throwing a party for 800 of your closet friends can be? As a member of our Volunteer Corps you will be eligible for the following perks:

Volunteer Dollars and Other Rewards

For every hour you work, you will receive one Volunteer Dollar, which can be used like cash in the snack bar at the hotel gift shop or in our dealers room. The 3 volunteers who donate the most hours of work will receive autographed T-Shirts featuring ConFusion's Guests of Honor, and as many other notable authors, artists and musicians as we can get to sign them for you. Other special rewards for all volunteers will be available at the Saturday night pizza party, open to all volunteers who have committed to working 6 or more hours throughout the weekend.

Volunteer Suite

The volunteer suite is for volunteers who have committed to working 8 or more hours during the weekend. It will have separate rooms for men and women to sleep in throughout the convention as well as a place to store your gear when you are not sleeping. The Suite will be unlocked on an hourly basis during the hours of 10am - 10pm. After hours the key to the Volunteer Suite will be kept at Operations. The door to the Suite will be locked when no one is in the room but ConFusion is not responsible for lost, stolen or misplaced items.

Membership Reimbursement

Once you have worked 8 hours (6 with a valid student identification), you will be eligible for a reimbursement or membership rollover. Memberships will only be reimbursed if the convention makes enough money to do so, and checks will mailed after the convention. You may instead opt to have your membership roll over to ConFusion 2005.

A lot of our current staff members and ConCom Members started in the Volunteer Corps. If you think you would like to help us improve next year's party, please contact us at confusion-volunteers@stilyagi.org after the convention or talk to the department heads you are assisting at the convention.

Masquerade

Our second-ever formal Masquerade will be held in the Salons F/G/H at 8pm on Saturday. All are invited to participate and to attend! This year our MC is Gordon Rose, a veteran masquerade MC and our panel of judges includes our Artist GOH Julie Bell, and Boris Vallejo! In keeping with the convention theme, a special award is offered for the Masquerade entry judged as the Best 1970s Influenced science fiction or fantasy costume. Costumes must be registered for the Masquerade no later than 3:00 PM Saturday. Forms are available at Registration and/or Ops. Completed forms should be turned in at Ops. *Muster for masquerade participants is at 7pm in Dennison I. Salon doors open for Masquerade seating after 7:30pm. Awards will be announced at 11pm.*

Hall Costumes

In addition to the formal Masquerade, we will also have judges circulating on Saturday evening looking for hall costumes that deserve special recognition. In keeping with the Confusion 30 theme, there also will be a special award for the best "Early 1970s science fiction or fantasy" hall costume. You remember the early 1970s? Before Star Wars? If you want to be part of a Costume Parade (open to anyone in costume) leading up to the awards announcement on Saturday night, show up near the Salons at 10:45pm and be ready to play "Follow-the-Leader."

Junk Pile Wars

Ever looked at a winning costume and thought "I could do that, with one hand tied behind my back and only one hour to make it?" Well, here's your chance to prove it!! This year ConFusion is offering DIY costumers a chance to play Junk Pile Wars. We supply basic tools, a room, and a pile of random supplies. You supply your innate creativity and craft a costume in only one hour. Afterwards, go that one step further and compete in the special popular-vote lightning round at the Masquerade. Junk Pile Wars is scheduled for 6pm Saturday evening to lead you into the Masquerade. (No, it's not a devious plot. It just looks like a devious plot.) Junk Pile Wars is limited to 10 participants.

Room Party Contest

It's back and better than ever. Our secret panel of judges will be roaming the hallways looking for the cream of the room party crop. The party chosen as "Best Party" will receive a free room night at ConFusion 2005. Additional prizes will be awarded in three catagories - Best Food, Best Drink and Best Theme.

The Confusion XXX Art Show and Auction is one of the highlights of the convention. We have been working hard to expand the variety and quality of art to be displayed at this year's show.
