We plan the convention for the traditional time -- over the American Labour Day weekend, 2-6 Sept. 1999. Spend your summer holidays enjoying the Australian winter! Instead of sweltering in the Western Zone, spend the Worldcon in the invigorating 50- to 60-degree Fahrenheit temperatures of

It costs less to get to Australia than you think -- commercial air + hotel packages from San Francisco are offered now for US\$899 or less. Although it's too early to predict for 1999, rates for three- to five-star hotels near the World Trade Centre have been confirmed through 1996 at \$67 to \$130. And when you get here, you'll find your dollar goes a long way -- the Australian dollar has been averaging about 75 cents U.S. Begin saving only a dollar a day now, and by 1999 you'll have enough to cover a fantastic holiday.
