Since the argument started in Canada many moons ago, it behooves me to back-track a couple of steps and say that there would be the perfect answer to thought transmission and language barriers. If you keenest of fan-minds remember, Hurter says that thought-transmission could not exist because too many languages are spoken and that thoughts are thought in their own language.

All right, suppose they do. Here's your answer: a universal language----and the language, Esperanto.

Esperanto is widely known in the world today--there is no doubt of that. From pole to pole and from California to Japan, around the world, hundreds of people who speak hundreds of different tongues correspond and speak together because they have a common denominator, Esperanto.

Hundreds of people employ thought transmission. I could go into detail and support that statement, but I won't. Let it suffice to say that more people than you think read each other's minds. All right, hundreds of people speak together in a common language, although their own tongues are widely diversified. Hundreds of people use thoughttransmission. Put the two together, and I'm a bobbed-tail calf if I see why it can't be done.

Of course, such a plan wouldn't work in every instance. Many of these thought-readers are imbeciles who can't read or spell their own names, and it would be next to impossible to teach them a language, even one as simple as Esperanto.
