Wuch terms as: "stefmist" and "fantast" have boen offered to fill the undoubtec nead for a subatituto, hut closer consideration brings out their hiddeni lacks, Onn substitute must a-short wond like "fan". If it is not to begim with, it will rapidly shontenea in the course of usage. "gtofnist" would thus become "stef"--word we already have: "fentast" could only be shortenod to, "fan"--the word wo are trying-to oscape because of its undesirable.conmotations. Another things both thege terms possess that darnable "f" that has made fandom a league of sputterers. As ar resulte wara. forced to conclude. that the terms so far offered are noble. suggabtions, but they somehow miss boing quite the term wo noed. One them begins to wonder whether anothor angle of atteck on the problem: aight not bs more produative. Thus wondening. one prognesseg to action.

As Robert. Heinlein brought out so wall ini his Denvontiom speach, fandom's most striking charactaristic is tha: "time-birding" ebility---the ability to view the.past, pnosent and futune ais ones, The past and the future are nearly as real. to us as the present, and wa ovaluate nearly evorything from this viewpoint. But when we attempt to reduce "timominaing" to a three or foun-ietter, one syllable. word, we. run smack into several varietjes of brick walls. Remembering that all good littile English words are derjved or made up from. Latin: roots or something, we quickly grab our Latim: dia tionary, and thumb through it feverishly---to no avail. Monentarily stumped, we try thinking again. Boside this time-bindines viewooint there ia also the fact that probably the majority of out stf and fantagy literature: deals with tino in ona way or another, A story may be laid in tho distant past, far in the future, some nearer location. in between, or in any of a number of parallel pasts or futures. It may even deal direatly with travel ini tino. It appeams that "time" itself plays a large pant. The Latine wora for "tina" is "tempus". That shortons beautifuliy to "tom"--the ona: syllemle word wesve boon seeking.

Buti. let.'s noti get excited abcut our success yet. Our wore meets the test, of shortness, and its derivatini is pretty: sound. How ever, there are other things to coneider. Does iti explain what. we. are to an outsiden? No, it doesn!'t. Still, could any: other term that satisfied the rest of the requiremente? The outsidon on nom-fan: who could grasp any explanation of what wa fan are with any degree. of understanding, would bo: a potential fan: whe had not yeti discovered. fandom. One who aould not. understand a lengthy, explanatiom would scarcely be helped by a?on-word one. To such a one we must over romain a mystery, And if such a one must be answered witili sogething that will serve to satigfy his curiosity and retain his good opinion of our sansty, he can be told that old story about our boing interested in the hobby of amateur publishinge It looks like we may not have to worry about the word being self-explanatory. We proceed to other tests.

Fen have a penchant for combining words, often. with a teloscoping effecti. They love alliteration, and thoy: also have a perr chant for punning. Does our word. "tom" geet. this test? Let's try 1t.

We have tome or tomz for the plural form, and the feminine naturally becomes temme The combinations of terag and terzina are obvious and euphonious. Tempest occurs to us and wo hevo no difificulty in naming him. Ha This really begins to look promisinis Wo gearch for nice aljiterative temzine and column titlearmand lo, we find them in: abundance!
