

Babysitting is in the Clarion, Mezzanine Rooms 6-7. Professional child care is available Thursday through Monday for children under age 5 who have either a child's or attending membership. Babysitting is open the following hours:





Speculative Art Retrospective

Guest of Honor Vincent Di Fate, in collaboration with art curator Roger Reed, has assembled a major retrospective of speculative fiction illustration, published between 1880 and 1970. This retrospective, "Looking Back at Looking Beyond," will cover the vast spectrum of speculative art, from the dinosaur paintings of the late 19 century, to pulp magazine covers of the '30s, to movie posters of the '50s, to comic art, and to art created for NASA.

Nearly 200 paintings will be on display. "We want to pay tribute to those artists whose work is recognized in the field, but whose name may not be," Di Fate explained. "We want to acknowledge the early SF artists."
