

"GREAT ART SHOULD NEVER BE MUSHED UP!!" So said Linus Van Pelt in PEANUTS. It shouldn't be forgotten, either. Fan art has a tendency toward immediate oblivion, though, especially when it appears in low-circulation apazines. Sixty or seventy fans at most see it, appreciate it briefly, and bury it in their fanzine collections. To celebrate my tenth anniversary in fandom, I've assembled this small portfolio of art from my apazines of the past decade. There are 22 illustrations here that deserve a revival from oblivion; an opportunity for wider appreciation. Besides their inherent artistic value, I consider them to be symbolic of the worthwhile quality of fandom as a whole during the 1960's. Fandom is a valuable, productive microcosm, and I'm happy to have been a part of it.

Though the sheets are unfastened and need not be kept in any particular order, here is the arrangement in which they are being assembled:
