The Transatlantic Fan Fund, which carried Ron Bennett to California and back in 1958, has set as its next target the bringing of a fan from across the Atlantic to the 1960 British Convention. The official list of candidates has just been finalised, containing three names: Terry Carr, Don Ford, and Bjo Wells.

TERRY CARR is a well-known trufan and actifan at present studying at the University of California, and with the reputation of a Publishing Giant to boot, producing INNUENDO (a fanzine, already one of the best, that improves with every issue) as well as being one of those responsible for the fannish newszine FANAC. He is also no mean hand

at fannish writing, and could be relied upon to produce a worthwhile report of the trip if he won.

DON FORD is the man who ran the American end of TAFF for the first several years of its existence without having first received the benefit of a paid transatlantic journey, in which he differs from all others who have administered the fund, from either side of the Atlantic.
