AS I MENTIONED IN MY SUPPLEMENTAL SFFA ZINE LAST TIME, shortly after publishing *Historical Hugo Hysteria*, I realized that in addition to the lists, statistics would be interesting to have. How many times did each player have at bat? How many times did they get a hit? What was their batting average? In other words: who has the most nominations, and most wins? I think Harlan still *claims* the most wins, even though it's not true — at least for raw fiction. More interesting, who's been most successful. Has anyone won every time they've been nominated? Has anyone lost every time they've been nominated?

I finally had a chance to finish knocking this together the couple of evenings after getting mailing 229 out the door. I added code to the Perl script I used to generate *Historical Hugo Hysteria*, and did a bit of fumdidling about with the formatting. In short, the Perl script now generates a single input file, which can be formatted into either this zine or the one I previously published. This zine will neatly fit in the centerfold of the original one if you're so inclined. The data and software are still available for the asking.

One final point: this is a list of the fiction nominees only; it doesn't include the dramatic presentation winners and nominees like this zine's predecessor.

Nominations: This is the list of nominations per author, sorted by number of nominations. We only include those who have had more than two nominations so the list will fit on one page. In the case of famous couples like Pohl and Kornbluth, Niven and Pournelle, George and Gracie, nominations are counted for both partners.

Batting Average: Here we sort the list by ratio of wins to nominations, with preference to more nominations. Thus, Walter Miller with two nominations and two wins ranks above Robert Bloch with one nomination and one win. We show the average and number of nominations for each author.

Note that Michael Bishop's zero wins in nine outings for fiction is still beaten by Arthur Hlavaty's zero wins out of twelve consecutive nominations for best fanwriter. However, that pales in comparison to the record jointly held by Stanley Schmidt and David Hartwell, who have each had twenty-four nominations and no wins.
