results of the ballot for DUFF 1985

There were 193 valid votes cast in the 1985 DUFF race: 39 in Australia and 154 in the USA. Additionally, there were 5 votes for "No Preference" (1 in Aus, 4 in the US), one late ballot and one which included no voting fee. These were the results of the primary vote:

AUSTRALIA: RBrown 4; M&RCantor 19; MGlicksohn 7; JStopa 6; Holdover 0; Write-in 3 (Dana Siegel; John Bangsund; Martha Beck).

USA: RBrown 31; M&RCantor 52; MGlicksohn 35; JStopa 31; Holdover 4; Write-in 1 (Bill the Cat).

DUFF 1986: DUFF 1986 will be paying for an Australian delegate to Confederation, the 1986 worldcon in Atlanta, Georgia. To qualify as a candidate the fan needs the nomination of two American and three Australasian fans. ("American" subsumes all fans in the Americas.) They will also need to post a bond and submit a 100 word policy statement. Candidates also need to give an undertaking that they will attend Confederation. Nominations are likely to close around the time of Aussiecon II, and further details of the exact requirements will be published later. Meanwhile, consider.
