"The Administration should step up the air strikes on North Vietnam's military targets...and should cut off the flow of supplies by sea into North Vietnam." - Richard M. Nixon, November 1965, quoted in New York Post, 26 September 1968

"Public protestations of our desire for peace feelers tend to prolong the war rather than shorten it." - Richard M. Nixon, April 1967, quoted ibid.

"A national television audience today heard Gov. Spiro T. Agnew declare that the Republican ticket had no plan for ending the war in Vietnam." - New York Times, 23 September 1968

"We will have to stop it with victory, or it will start all over again in a few years." - Richard M. Nixon, Good Housekeeping, July 1968

"Governor Agnew said that, if he had been President last spring, the poverty marchers would never have been allowed to set up Resurrection City in Washington... 'We don't have to guarantee dissenters free lodging while they dissent.'

"Suppose they used the parks anyway, he was asked.

"I think I would have taken steps, the same as the steps that were taken in Chicago..." - New York Times, 23 September 1968

"Kikes for Kennedy, Nazis for Nixon!" - George Lincoln Rockwell, October 1960.

"When I become your President the first thing my Attorney General will do is get an indictment against any college professor calling for a Viet Cong victory and put him under a good federal jail." - George C. Wallace, New York Post, 16 September 1968

"I'm gonna make race the basis of politics in this state, and I'm gonna make it the basis of politics in this country." - George C. Wallace, New York Post, 17 September 1968

"Let us rise to the call of the freedom-loving blood that is in us. In the name of the greatest people that have ever trod this earth, I draw the line in the dust and toss the gauntlet before the feet of tyranny. And I say, Segregation now! Segregation tomorrow! Segregation forever!" - George C. Wallace, inaugural address, January 1963

"It is theoretically possible that George Wallace might be able to run as a third party candidate in 1968 and win, thus solving most of our problems, since Wallace, while not a Nazi, is close enough so that, as President, he would probably preserve our nation and race." - George Lincoln Rockwell, quoted, New York Post, 21 September 1968

"I'm not going to denounce the John Birch Society. Its members are some of our finest citizens. Its opposition to communism is well-founded. I appreciate the fact that these people want to support me." - George C. Wallace, quoted, New York Post, 21 September 1968

"Michael A. Calo, who has been convicted several times on charges of passing bad checks and street fighting, is heading the Wallace campaign in Waterbury 'primarily because of the law and order issue'...Mr. Calo, whose arrest record spans 15 years, calls himself the state coordinator, the title by which Wallace volunteers here generally refer to him." - New York Times, 22 September 1968

"Nixon is going to do the same things as Wallace, and do them more effectively." - James L. Buckley, Conservative senatorial candidate in New York, New York Times, 27 September 1968

"When we're elected, we'll take care of people like you! Okay, boys, throw him out!" - Richard M. Nixon to a heckler, The Facts About Nixon, 1960.

"According to the specific criteria I have proposed, no individual who has refused to testify before a legislative committee investigating Communism or who has refused to register under the Subversive Activities Control Act would be allowed to speak on the campus of a tax-supported institution." - Richard M.
