The meeting started 11:24 a.m.

Mike Thorsen was thanked by Karl for taking his place and running the October regular Board meeting.

The minutes of regular meeting were approved with one small change. The name "Ed" was substituted for the

name "Scott" as Ed was the person at Conjecture who was advertising LOSCON 33, and extraneous material was deleted.

The minutes of the special October 11 meeting were approved with a few small changes. The heading "Charlie's class" was changed to "Charles Lee Jackson II's class" and the wording of the paragraph stating the appointment of Greg Barrett was changed to, "John Amato was thanked for his work as co-Librarian pro tem. **Greg Barrett** was appointed as **Librarian** with a review in 6 months.

Treasurers Report: The treasurer is ill, so there was no report, and her proxy was given to Ed Green.

Facilities: Ed Green says there will be only one more general cleaning until after the holidays. Possible hiring of a cleaning person to assist was discussed. (Along with the status of J. Edgar.)

Furniture: It was reported that one of the couches has a broken slat in the back. There is still an appropriation for more new chairs. There was a discussion of broken chairs.

Building Repairs: A plumber is needed because of a problem with a sprinkler head and pressure on the line (water is leaking from the head even when it is turned off). MSP (Moved, Seconded, Passed) that Karl appoint a committee of 2 people to look into getting a plumber to do this work - Thorsen and Null were appointed.

Ed is still not getting the sign done, but will check with his new boss and see if he has any connections with sign makers/installers, to see if he can find someone reliable and inexpensive."

Gestetner: There was a discussion about the machine. Marty reported that Ricoh has discontinued production of all machines of this type. Parts are still available for repairs but there is a finite supply of parts. His recommendation to the Board was that any part which was beginning to cause a problem be replaced immediately, while parts are still available. There was a small, general discussion about machine replacement, and it was mentioned that we consider some method of funding the replacement.

Video Projector: Brett has noticed a problem with the image. There was a discussion of repair vs. getting a new machine.

lasfs.org: Scott says he is in the middle of a redesign, about 50% being done, with several people soon to be

contributing pages.

Service Mark: Brett says Michael Denardo (a volunteer patent attorney) is looking at and helping with our application. A new application has been filed to get a proper designation as the first designation was wrong and we are not allowed to change it. First designation is for Private Lending Library. The second is for organizing exhibitions.

Club computer: There was a discussion of how and when to upgrade the computer.

Marketing Committee: The committee is busy working on LOSCON. It is also developing displays for cons.
