Lee Grixit: There's another possible breakthrough for diabetes, implantables with long-term supplies. You'd have an implant with a couple year's supply of insulin dispensed at proper intervals.

There's also a smaller handheld ultrasonic machine that breaks up kidney stones. And there's a new, portable neuro inductive router with minimal attachments to help a patient's brain get their limbs moving again.

Open Forum

Eylat Poliner asked a friend to come to Loscon. The friend felt unsafe after the Gregory Benford incident. If it can happen to Gregory Benford, it can happen to anybody. Are we handling incidents incorrectly? For future conventions, maybe talk to people. Poliner said she would bring it up in the board meeting.

Heide Nichols had a very similar reaction from someone she has known since she was a teenager. The friend said, "We don't do Loscon anymore." We need a procedure to do this privately and not in public for the rumor mill.

Cathy Johnson: We should handle things privately, and the Benford incident was handled incorrectly. Nobody questions that. Any such thing in the future, we would not handle that way.

Michelle Pincus: People fear that if they say One Wrong Word, they will be kicked out of the convention and canceled, not only at that con but in fandom.

Johnson: He was our next Writer Guest of Honor, for the 2020 virtual and 2021 in-person convention, so he was not canceled permanently.

Pincus: A member has requested that we ban all discussion and conversation about the Israel-Hamas war.

Poliner: That is a very sensitive topic, but all we can really do is take action when people start arguing.

Nick Smith was there at the Benford incident. The fallout was not based on the rumors so much, but the other people who were at the autograph table at the same time have not returned to Loscon since. When something happened at Smith's Loscon, it was handled privately and there was no major blowback for the con or the club. It has already been addressed. It will take some time to make people understand that it has been handled.

Poliner: There's still one person who is still threatening to sue us.

Smith: We have not embarrassed him in public.

Susan Fox: We need to publicize a code of conduct for the convention runners, and show transparency about the change in procedure.

Poliner: Other people have expressed grievances about Loscon, including vendors' lack of sales at Loscon.

Johnson: We need to grow new people to come to Loscon.

Rob Powell: We don't want to be completely transparent about the incidents, but we do need to be transparent about our procedures. We need to be clear about our improved policies. Naming names is not necessary; focus on the policies.

Poliner thanked the board for the discussion. She will report back to the person who asked in the first place.

Loscon logistics: We have a temporary storage space. We have a rental truck. We are getting a smaller truck this year, to save budget. We need volunteers for loading and unloading.

Numbers for items in storage: We need the numbers of art show equipment units

The truck and tech are both unloading at the lower level by the ballrooms. Both will arrange with our hotel liaison, Jason Justice.

Loading and unloading, before and after: Art show, and office supplies. Please keep Powell in the loop.

Poliner will reach out to Joyce Sperling about the office.

Pincus will round up loading and unloading volunteers.

We have a 16-foot truck, "overcap" instead of smaller version. There's one problem: The height does not match the dock, but we can unload at the Ballroom level. The savings is significant. We are renting from Enterprise this time.

Gavin Claypool had three mini-topics. Is there a bid for Westercon 77? Not yet. There is a seated bid for Westercon 76 in Utah. One possible future for Westercon is for it not to be an independent convention but a "label" associated with an existing western convention at their regular time.

Dean Johnson: Kevin Standlee brought that up. There would need to be by-laws changes. (<https://kevin-standlee.dreamwidth.org/2277786.html>)

Loscon is in favor of civil discourse and not its opposite.

Fox: Emphasize that we believe in respectful free speech but will not tolerate uncivil behavior.

Cathy Johnson and Powell recommended we take issues to con ops. If it escalates from there, that's not on the con floor.

The Benford incident brought some fallout from bringing things up in an open way. One possibility: We could draft a letter to give to people who bring it up again, instead of dragging it out yet again in public.

Powell will be available to get the books to the Loscon storage. They will talk after the meeting.
