Comments: 1964 was the last year Ziff-Davis had control of Amazing. The figures clearly show that Cele Goldsmith and Z-D were rapidly running Amazing into the ground. Nearly 2% of all copies distributed were given away free!

However, when Sol Cohen took over, he increased subscriptions by 1,000, trimmed free copies by 600, and improved newsstand distribution by over 10,000, the biggest increase in sales for any s-f magazine in the past decade. Clearly Cohen, with one new story per month and scads of reprints, has turned Amazing into a money-making proposition.

Interplanetary Colonization Dept.: The January 2nd issue of Technology week featured a news story postulating the Russians would 1: In the near future place in orbit a spaceship with a crew of 4 or more for 3-4 weeks duration. 2: Possibly two men at a time would participate in EVA. 3: The Soviet Union is placing more emphasis than the US on animals in space, and will probably orbit and land on the moon before Russian Cosmonauts do. 4: At least 5 years from now, the Russians will set up lunar colonies, using hydroponics, native materials, and will use these colonies for scientific experiments, observatories, and preparations for interplanetary travel. At the International Astronautical Federation Congress in Madrid in 1966, Dr. Ivan Timofeyevich Akulinichev, considered a spokesman for the Russian scientific community, spoke on using the colonies for experiments in principles of interplanetary travel, presumably with nuclear and ionic motors. The Russian hydroponic program is concentrating on growing the higher plants, including potatoes, white cabbage, carrots, beets, tomatoes, radishes, and Chinese cabbage.

The Russians are also experimenting with control of gravity.
