SECRETARY TREASURER'S REPORT

THE MEMBERSHIP

The roster follows. You should be on the watch for any of the following symbols in the right hand margin following your name and address:

D - Your dues are due to the Secretary Treasurer before the next mailing date, which is the 8th of May, 1982. Dues are \$12 for all members.

A - You owe activity by the next mailing date, 8 May. The number of pages you owe is shown immediately before the renewal month column. Activity that is contained in this (February) mailing has not been counted.

AMay, AAug, etc - Used for new members. Pages owed are due in or before the mailing for the month shown.

\$ - Your dues were due in my hands no later than the 13th of February. As of the date this roster is being typed, 3 February, they have not been received.

ATM - The pages you owe must be in this February mailing, or in a prior postmailing not yet received by me.

If you have funds on deposit, the information is shown as a parenthetical dollar amount following your address. If the word AIR is also used it means that you have asked that your bundle be sent airmail with the excess cost to be deducted from funds on deposit.

The dingbat # indicates a change of name or address since the last roster. COA's and dues should be sent to the Secretary Treasurer, preferably at least two weeks before the mailing deadline. We pick up COA's only from specific letter or postcard notification, and not from your fanzine or other sources.

I have a nagging feeling that if I were not an Old Phart President secluded in the Sierra foothills that I would have a better understanding of the John Thiel situation. Something doesn't feel quite right about this, but I haven't heard directly from anyone...

Anyhow, John wrote in November asking about the whereabouts of the November mailing (I didn't know but it arrove eventually) and asked about the eligibility of SHADOW FAPA. Now I'm not the OE, and in fact I have less to say about the operation of the organization than at least two other of-ficers, but my feelings about "franking" have always run a bit contrary to most. I've always felt that FAPA was an organization dedicated to providing fannish reading to its members, primarily the work of the members themselves but not restricted to membership only. My own publications are mostly my own work, but I have on occasion used contributions and columns by others, as ap-proved by the constitution, and many magazines in the past have appeared which contained the works of a great many non-members and still qualified for in-clusion.

The way I've always felt about franking is this: if a member comes across a publication, not his own, which contains material which in his opinion would be of interest to FAPA, and which otherwise he (the member) would have printed on his own had it not already been printed by someone else, then including it in the mailing under his "frank" is a reasonable action. Retyping twenty stencils just to make a publication essentially the work of a member has never seemed to be to be the important act quali-fying something as being worth reading or not.

So I told John that as far as I was concerned, SHADOW FAPA was ad-missable.

After that, John wrote Seth about renewal credentials and that started me wondering. Is FAPA really all that complicated? At any rate, Seth's reply was a masterpiece, well worthy of two pages of credit if he needed any and al-most suitable for permanent inclusion in the constitution. (It says what the constitution says, only understandably.) If I, as President, had any powers at all, I would demand that the OE print Seth's letter in the next FA. Well, so much for that.

Otherwise, I have kept FAPA's progress on an even course this year and no doubt work on my monument continues apace.

When a letter from former Fapan Terry Hughes showed up in my mailbox a few days back I thought that maybe it was good news. "Well," I might have said to myself, "about time that Terry got back onto the waiting list."
