Official Editor's Report

There was not overwhelming response to our plea for people to run for office till a bit of last minute phone calling. In fact President and VP would have been unfilled except for actions of the other two candidates. There were a few we have not yet confirmed so if the ballot looks funny (with the last minute correction due to surprised member claiming too much modesty to run) blame the Sec.-Treas. and myself. The candidates are fortunately all good people and it will be nice to have all or most of the officers in one place at each collation. However, please do keep running for office in mind next time. In keeping with the local slant to the FAPA elections, David Bratman, waitlister just making the roster this time and frequent FAPA collator has agreed to be teller for the elections.

David, like Peggy, Shay, and myself, will be at Worldcon. Thus the very lazy or thrifty can turn in ballots at the FAPA party. Yes, as Peggy Rae writes above, she is putting on a FAPA party in her room at 3 pm Sunday at the Worldcon. Remember, it is BYOB and glass. I look forward to seeing some of you for the first time (I go to cons only slightly less rarely than Harry Warner and for much the same reasons).

Writing in a partisan manner, I do hope you will all vote for the dues increase and save FAPA from bankruptcy next year. We are losing \$30-60 each mailing and may have our surplus disappear soon.

The meaning of "tentative" on the ToC is for zines that I have been told will be delivered at collation or know were in the mail in time to arrive. Essentially it means that when I type the ToC on Saturday morning that it is a zine not in hand and could potentially not appear in the mailing. If you are worried that your zine may be postal delayed, drop me a note or call and I will consider holding the mailing a day extra if convenient (no guarantees). If a zine is delivered on collation day without my being told, it will still go into the mailing but not be listed in the ToC.

Once again I remind people to please send at least 68 copies and preferably a few more to make collators life easier. I consistently make use of at least one extra copy each time to replace destroyed or lost copies in the mail. Please remember that the Sec.-Treas. can not count for renewal credentials any zine that sent 65 instead of 68 copies.

I will mention again that any mail sent via the postal service (including express mail) should go to the PO Box. Only use my street address for mail that requires one and keep in mind there will be at least a day's delay as I have to leave my signature on the door after receiving first notice. The problem is that I am not home during usual mail delivery times. It is even worse for postal service express mail since they require an in person signature, so it may be some time before I can get that express mail package sent to my home address that had first attempted delivery on Friday. The problem with today is that I am about to go off to photocopy this, so if the postman does not arrive soon ... We will give you zine credit as soon as we get the package but it does not make this mailing, consider the above the explanation for why not.

The surplus stock sale continues as a regular and apparently popular feature. I got two requests for one of everything and thus am out of nearly all old mailings. Cost will be (for now) \$4 each complete mailing and \$2 for incompletes plus \$2 postage for the first one and \$1 for each beyond that. Preference will be given to waitlisters. The most recent mailing will always not be available so that those bundles can remain for their primary use, replacement for copies lost in the mail. Currently available mailings are 181 postmailing (\$1 plus \$1 postage, 1 copy) and 187 (1 copy).

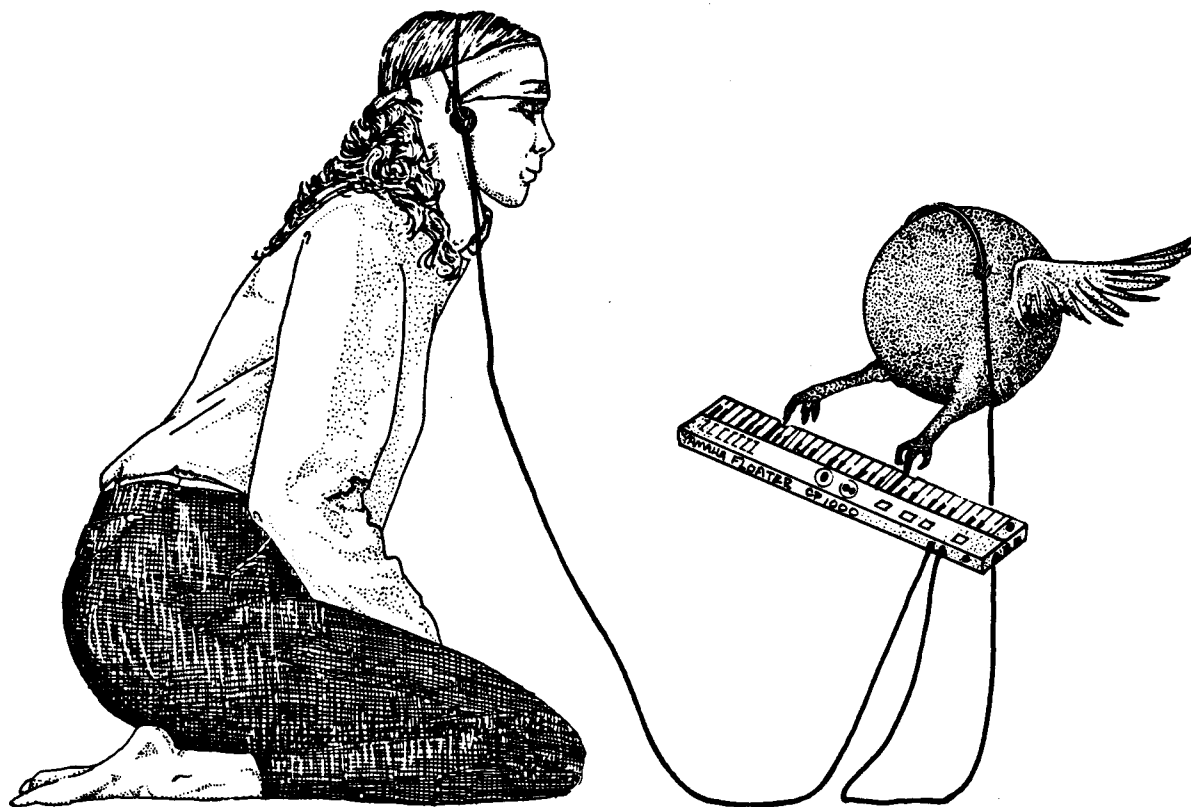
The Roster

- Month Feb, May, Aug, Nov: your 'FAPA' year is counted from this month.
- Pages A number from 0 to 8, inclusive, that indicates the number of pages you owe.
- Activity A You owe some pages by November 10, 1984. Please note that I've not counted pages included in the August, 1984 mailing.
- ATM The pages you owe must be in this August mailing or in a postmailing that I have yet to receive.
- ANov or AFeb or AMay or AAug: for first-year members--you owe your first activity by the month indicated.
- Dues D Your dues are due. Please send them to me by November 10th, 1984. Dues are still \$12.00.
- \$ Your dues were due by August 11th, 1984. As of today, which is August 11, 1984, your dues have not arrived. If your dues don't turn up postmarked by August 11, they are in arrears and you must petition to retain your membership.
- Deposit The dollar amount of the funds you have on deposit.
- Misc # This member's name or address have changed since the last mailing.
- AIR You requested that your mailings be sent airmail. The extra postage will be deducted from your funds on deposit.
- FIR You requested that your mailings be sent first class. The extra postage will be deducted from your funds on deposit.
