Brave New World, Aldous Huxley's famed classic, was recently reprinted by Harper in a brand new edition, at \$2.50. The news that this great tale will once again be available in bookstores everywhere is welcome to all followers of scientifiction. -jrk

Mistress Masham's Repose, by T. H. White (Putnam, \$2.75), is a fantastic satire in the Jonathan Swift vein, with an island full of Lilliputians the main feature of the story. Though reportedly not up to this author's Hyper Sword In The Stone, the book at least should make enjoyable reading. -jrk
