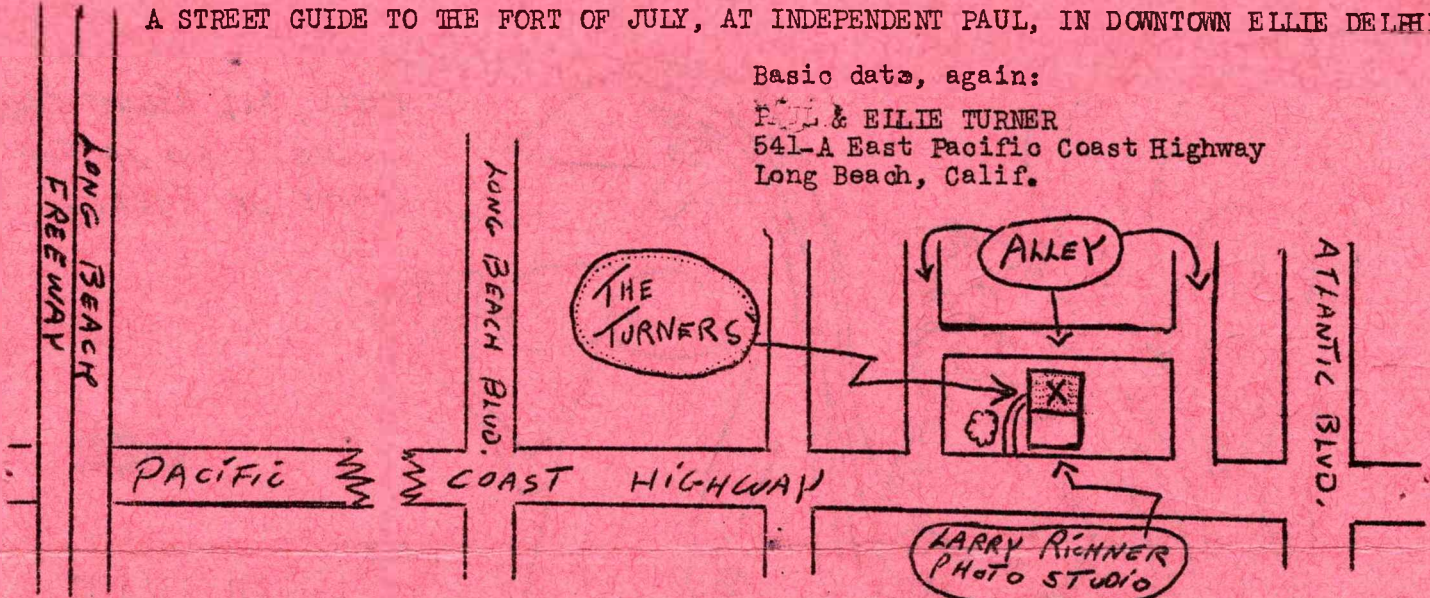
Admission for each and all is one buck. All funds collected in excess of costs are intended, of course, for the LASFS Clubhouse Fund.
