NEXT MEETING: The next MSFS meet will be Sunday, 2 October 1949, at the home of Howard Devore, 16535 Evanston, Detroit, Michigan. The crisis of the meeting came during a debate over whether to start enforcing the present MSFS constitution, or to write a new constitution based on the way the club is actually running now. Everyone but President George Young favored the rewrite job. Incautiously, George left the room during the debate, attracted by the sumptuous table of food Pat had just provided in another room. Unscrupulously, his opponents took advantage of his absence to move, second and approve a motion to rewrite the constitution. Then everyone else dashed for the food, too.

When he learned of this underhanded action, George began to protest, and threatened to use his Presidential powers to block action. Immediately a petition to impeach the President was begun, but before the necessary signatures could be obtained, George realized that the President is the official who appoints committees, and withdrew his objections. His opponents withdrew the petition.

Then everyone went for the food.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTION: Included in this issue of THE MICHIFAN is the revised constitution as written by Ralph Flurette and Art Rapp. It must be approved by two-thirds of the MSFS membership in order to become effective. Postcard ballots for this pur-

pose are included in the copies of THE MICHIFAN going to members of the MSFS. Please mark and mail these immediately so that this question may be settled as soon as possible.

The ballots include space for any criticisms of the constitution which you may have. Even if you vote YES, let us know if there is anything you particularly dislike in the proposed constitution.

We suggest you compare this constitution with the present one, which was printed in the last issue of THE MICHIFAN. The major changes are these:

Dues raised from \$1.00 to \$1.50 per year, and Associate Memberships at \$1.00 per year created for persons living outside Michigan.

Officers' duties outlined in general terms, details of carrying them out being left to the officer concerned. Treasurer duties transferred from the Director of Publications to the Secretary-Treasurer. A new post, Director of Press Relations, created.

Election procedure changed from written ballot to nomination and election at the winter State Convention. Two-year limitation on office-holding dropped.

The system of local chapters dropped. Board of Directors dropped. THE MICHIFAN designated the Official Organ (leaving THE MUTANT as a MSFS project, but no longer included in the annual dues.)

The reasons for most of these changes are obvious -- in many instances, as a simplification of operating methods. The dues increase is in order to make the annual income from dues cover normal operating expenses, so that any additional money can be used for projects. If you stop to realize that the 25 issues of THE MICHIFAN you get in one year cost 50¢ in postage alone, you can see the dues aren't excessive.

HALLOWE'EN PARTY: Hey, here's something you won't want to miss -- a MSFS Hallowe'en party, with costumes yet! -- in Owosso on Saturday night, the 29th of October. Starting at 8:30 p.m., and continuing until neighbors start throwing rocks through the windows. It's at Pat Crossley's, and you can register for it by sending her one buck at 707 W. Main St., Owosso, Michigan. If you wait until the night of the party to pay your share of the eats and drinks, it'll cost you a dollar and a half. Make it two bucks and bring the girlfriend (or boyfriend, if you're a femme yourself). Observe his/her reactions to music, dancing, weirdly-garbed stfen, and undoubtedly enough uproar to drive anyone but a fan mad, mad, MAD beyond your wildest dreams! See ya there!

# PROPOSED CONSTITUTION OF THE

## MICHIGAN SCIENCE-FANTASY SOCIETY

**PREAMBLE:** Realizing that a single individual is unable to do much for fandom, we are gathering together the readers of science-fiction and fantasy in Michigan and surrounding vicinity.

We hereby establish under this Constitution the Michigan Science-Fantasy Society as a league of individuals interested in furthering the enjoyment of science-fiction and fantasy by themselves and others.

This organization is created for freedom-loving people. It is now, and shall remain, non-political, non-sectarian, and non-racial. We retain the right to refuse membership to any person, intelligent being, or BEM.

### ARTICLE I - Membership:

Section 1 - Applicants for membership must register their name, address and telephone number with the Secretary.

Section 2 - Dues of \$1.50 per calendar year must accompany registration.

Section 3 - Persons residing outside the state of Michigan may become Associate Members of the MSFS upon payment of \$1.00 annual dues. Associate Members are entitled to all benefits and privileges of the MSFS except the privilege of voting.

### ARTICLE II - Officers:

Section 1 - President, shall preside at meetings, act as the official spokesman of the MSFS, and see that other MSFS officers perform their various duties.

Section 2 - Vice President, shall assist the President in the performance of his duties, and shall take over as presiding officer in the absence of the President.

Section 3 - Secretary-Treasurer, shall act as custodian of all records, funds and property of the MSFS, shall maintain an accurate roster of the membership, shall issue credentials to new members, and shall be responsible for notification of forthcoming meetings, shall furnish a financial report to the Director of Publications at the end of each quarter, same to be published in the Official Organ.

Section 4 - Director of Publications, shall be responsible for production and distribution of such publications as the Society shall designate.

Section 5 - Director of Press Relations, shall be responsible for all press notices and articles pertaining to the Society being prepared for local papers of all members.

ARTICLE III - Administrative Procedure:

Section 1 - Business meetings of the MSFS shall be held according to the rules of parliamentary procedure.

Section 2 - Nomination and election of officers shall be held during the business session of the Winter state convention. All elections shall be for one calendar year (January 1 - December 31).

Section 3 - Petitions, of whatever purpose (except as provided in Section 4 of this Article), when signed by at least 10% of the membership, shall be subject to a majority vote of the membership.

Section 4 - Petitions for impeachment of officers cannot be initiated until officer has served at least 30 days in office.

Section 5 - Amendment of this Constitution may take place by two-thirds vote of the MSFS membership.

ARTICLE IV - Miscellaneous:

Section 1 - There shall be a state convention of the MSFS every six months, place and time of meeting to be determined by the membership at least 90 days in advance.

Section 2 - THE MICHIFAN shall be the Official Organ of the MSFS, and shall be published and distributed to all members and associate members, and otherwise as directed by the Secretary.

Section 3 - This Constitution shall become effective immediately upon ratification by two-thirds of the MSFS membership.
