The Outlander Society was formed Oct. 2nd. 1948. No official officers or rules. All members must live in the Los Angeles area, but not within the L.A. City limits. Mrs. Freddie Hershey serves as first Treasurer, Rick Sneary, final one. Membership started with 8, and rased to 14-18, at end.. Informal, social gathering.. Group activity ended in 1954-55.. -- Editorship of magazine rotated, but entire group worked on it.. Was sent out as a gen-zine--- but used material by the members almost exclusively. (letters of comment, excepted.)

The above information is derived not so much from a good memory as good bookkeeping records.. Society records show when money was paid out to mail out some of those issues which have no date or number.
