

THERE AND BACK AGAIN. A couple possibilities for cheap transportation to and from the LonCon II next August have been ferreted out: George Scithers reports that almost all airlines charge the same fares for a New York-London-New York trip, and that fare ranges from \$300 to \$700, depending on conditions. If 25 or more people buy their tickets as a group and travel both ways as a group, and travel on weekdays, returning to New York after 6 Sept., the fare is \$325. For individuals leaving the U.S. after 3 Aug and returning after 28 Sept., the jet fare is \$399. (If you leave after 3 Aug. but return before 28 Sept, it's about \$440.) The exception to these is Icelandic Airlines, which charges \$389 for an individual leaving after 3 August and returning after 28 Sept., and \$389 if you return before 28 Sept. Icelandic uses prop planes, but its safety record is excellent. Early reservations are essential, probably by mid-January. If your local travel agent is unhelpful, try the Icelandic offices in New York (610 Fifth Ave), Chicago (37 S Wabash Ave) or Frisco (210 Post St).

For the Califans, Ben Stark reports that you can get from LA to Frankfurt Germany for \$395 round trip next year if you join The Californians (aka The International Club of Calif) by mid-February and if they have any seats open on their charter, which leaves LA on 18 August and returns on 14 September. It costs about \$10-\$15 to join, so the trip would cost about \$410 plus the round trip fare Frankfurt-London and back (which shouldn't be too much -- Scithers should be able to report it for next issue.) The club address is 11526 Burbank Blvd, N. Hollywood, Cal.

The con is being arranged by the newly-founded Swedish SF Convention Society. ++ Another new org, the Swedish Science Fiction Academy, was founded in November. The Academy will publish an annual volume, SCANDIFANDOM 19___, as a yearbook of fan activity, and will present an award annually to the person doing the most to further the development of SF in Scandinavia during the previous year.
