DON FORD DEAD

Don Ford, TAFF Representative to the 1960 Britcon, Chairman of the 1949 Cinvention, and longtime member of the Cincinnati Fantasy Group, died Friday April 2nd, at 11 PM, of cancer. Discovery of the cancer and the subsequent operation by Doc Barrett were too late. Don was a founding member of First Fandom, and attended many conventions, beginning with the 1948 Torcon. He also was a founder of the Midwestcon, and the first US administrator of TAFF. He was a member of OMPA, for which he published POOKA, beginning in 1955. Don was 44 at his death. He leaves his wife Margaret and three children.

CHEAP RATES TO LONDON: The Bristol City Line (c/o Charles Hill & Sons, 1 Broadway, NY 10004) runs fortnightly freighters New York-Avonmouth (a port in Bristol, Eng.). They take 5 passengers each ship -- 2 double cabins, 1 single -- and charge \$168 each way during the May-Oct season. (\$154 each way during off-season.) The Black Diamond Steamship Corp. (2 Broadway, NY 10004) runs weekly freighters New York-Antwerp, returning to NY from Rotterdam. The fares are \$225 each way in season, \$175 off-season. They are Norwegian ships, carry 10 to 12 passengers each.

G'n'S Notes: Recordings of "Utopia, Ltd." are available from the Lyric Theater Co., 4521 - 38th St. NW, Washington, D.C. 20016, for \$11.75 including postage. The 3-record set includes the dialogue of this 13th G&S Opera, very little performed these days. The Lyric has also recorded Opera 14-and-last, "The Grand Duke," a few copies of which are still available, and they are contemplating a recording of "The Mountebanks," by Gilbert and Alfred Cellier (1892) -- expressions of interest needed.

ACE RELEASES FOR MAY include a re-issue of de Camp's Rogue Queen and a collection of short stories by Avram Davidson, What Strange Stars and Skies, as well as the third of Norton's Witch World books, Three Against the Witch World. In addition there is a collection of Gahan Wilson's s**t**a**g**e cartoons, called Graveside Manner. If you've only got 40¢ to spend on pb's, get this one to add to your Addams collection.

APAc: The 24th N'APA mailing (March) shows a drop of 10 members for various reasons, with eight new members filling some of the blanks, and only five on the WL. Any member of the NFFF wishing to join this rather small WL should send \$1 first year's dues with his application to Fred Patten, 1825 Greenfield, LA 90025, Cal.) The mailing contains 338 pages, of which more than 20% is Meskys's NIEKAS 11. ++ The 15th Mlg. of the Southern Fandom Press Alliance (also March) shows 20 members and a WL of 2, with a page-count of 153. SFPA's rule that 75% of the membership must be Southerners, as well as the rule that the OE must be a Southerner, has been amended to the effect that a member joining from a Southern address retains his status as a Southerner even when he moves. This is brewing up a storm in the OElection between Dave Hulan (A Southerner in Californian exile) and Larry Montgomery (A Southerner in residence). The postmailings have been flying ever since the mailing came out. ++ Bruce Pelz has been elected to a fifth term as SAPS OE with 11 votes out of 20 (5 for Wrai Ballard, 1 each Doreen Webbert and "Ho-Hum", 3 no vote.) ++ APA L Distribution 24: 140 pages.
