They were originally known for their Clickbook, a shareware utility that would turn any webpage into a sideways-printed booklet, without the staples in the middle of course."

FDA DEMANDS DESTRUCTION OF BOOKS ON STEVIA

Stevia is a safe medicinal herb that is both a sweetener and lowers blood sugar (strongly correlated with life extension). Stevioside is the sweetener from Stevia that is up to 200 to 300 times sweeter than sugar and contains no calories! Unlike aspartame it can be used in cooking, remaining stable up to 198 degrees.

Dr. Julian Whitaker said that "Of the two sweeteners (aspartame and Stevia), Stevia wins hands down for safety." The chemist, Dr. Leigh Broadhurst, said unlike saccharine, Stevia does not become bitter.

Much more concentrated than aspartame, [1] Stevia is a potential threat to the market domination of aspartame, which some claim has many negative health effects. [2] If

the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has its way, that may never happen. The FDA been harassing the Texas-based Stevita Co., which imports the sweetener.

On May 19th the FDA increased the pressure by demading that Stevita Co. destroy all their books on Stevia.

The FDA order states that FDA officials must be on site to "witness the destruction of the cookbooks, literature, and other publications for the purpose of verifying compliance" with the FDA's order to burn all the books. The following is from:

FDA ATTEMPTS TO COMPEL DESTRUCTION OF BOOKS

[On Natural Herbal Supplement

DALLAS - May 26, 1998 -- In an unprecendented move, US Food and Drug Administration officials threatened legal action against Texas-based Stevita Co., importers of the sweet-tasting herbal dietary supplement, Stevia - for distributing books and literature about their product.

The latest volley in a bitter battle has been fired at Texas-based Stevita Co. by federal Food and Drug Administration officials. The FDA, an agency of the federal government, is responsible for upholding the U.S. Constitution which guarantees freedom of speech and expression. This responsiblity was drawn into question on May 19th when FDA Compliance Officer, James R. Lahar faxed a letter to Stevita Co. addressing the destruction of 2,500 books he deemed "offending," at a cost to the company well in excess of \$10,000. The letter further threatens that investigators will conduct a current inventory and "witness the destruction of the cookbooks, literature, and other publications for the purpose of verifying compliance" upon visiting Stevita Co. for a fourth time this year.

One of three books in question is The Stevia Story -- A tale of incredible sweetness & intrigue, by Linda Bonvie, Bill Bonvie and Donna Gates with Foreword by James S. Turner, Esq.. Ironically, Chapter Four of the book the FDA wants to destroy is titled: "What's wrong with the FDA?"

An attempt to strongarm critics into silence --- similar to book burnings in Nazi Germany?

Oscar Rodes, President of the Stevita Company said the FDA ordered the action because the books contain general information that in-

clude: history, usages and scientific studies regarding stevia. Currently, Federal law requires stevia herbal products can only be marketed as dietary supplements without any mention of having sweetening power.

'Robert A. W. Lowndes

Newport--Robert A.W. Lowndes, 81, of 70 Harrison Ave., a nationally recognized author of science fiction stories, died Thursday, July 14, 1998, at the Village House Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Newport.

'Born in Bridgeport, Conn., on Sept. 4, 1916, he was the son of the late Harry I. and Fannie Stevens Lowndes. He moved to Newport in 1994 from Hoboken, NJ.

'Mr. Lowndes had worked as an editor in New York City for Gernsback Publishing Co., retiring in 1992.

'Mr. Lowndes attended Stamford Community College.

'He was primarily a science fiction writer and editor, and had been the author of five science fiction books. He was fourth on the list of Ten Most Prodigious Science Fiction Magazine Editors and begun as one of the youngest editors of science fiction in 1940 with Columbia Publications.

'He was then an editor for Avalon Books' Science Fiction Line, Sexology and Luz Magazines, and for Gernsback Publications' Radio Electronics Magazines.

'LUNACON and BOSKONE, both science fiction organizations, honored him in 1969 and in 1973, respectively.

'Mr. Lowndes was a member of the Lodge of Masons in New York, the Science Fiction Writers of America, The Baker Street Irregulars, The Scandalous Bohemians of New Jersey and the Praed Street Irregulars. He also acted in local community theaters in Suffren, NY.

'He was an avid reader with a great knowledge of history and a great lover of classical music.

'He leaves a stepson, Peter Rogalin of Glen Rock, NJ; a brother, Harry I. Lowndes Jr. of Kansas City, MO; a sister, Ruth C. Lowndes of Middleton; and four grandchildren.

'A memorial service will be held Sunday, July 19, at 2 pm in St. Paul's United Methodist Church, 12 Marlborough St.

This is extraordinarily sad news for the sf community, and a great loss to us. Those not familiar with his history don't know what they've missed, but I hope they find out: he was one of the greats.

Damn.

I'm not sure who it was, but someone recently mentioned to me that, when you see an e-mail subject header listing only an individual's name ... you know what the message is going to say.

I was so hoping that, for once, this would not be the case.

I never met Doc Lowndes. Not physically. But it was my privilege to know him for twenty-five years.

'I really don't recall the details of how I "inherited" him from Bergeron, but from "Outworlds Eight" [June, 1971] through "Outworlds 58" [9/18/88], it was my privilege (not a word used lightly in this context) to publish twenty installments of his column, "Understandings".

He humored me, put up with my delays and detours, was always supportive -- and was always there when I came back.

In the late 80s we started working on putting the columns together for eventual booklet/book publication. I retyped the first four columns on the Kaypro, and sent them to Doc for copyediting.

Then I was Went Away for a couple of years; phraseology deliberate.

When I came back, I received a letter from Doc, dated July 17, 1992:

"It's good to hear from you, and especially good to hear that you believe that you can continue on your edition of 'Understandings'. I shall most certainly give you as prompt and complete cooperation as I'm able. (It seems strange to me that now in my old age, where my time is running out, I don't feel in a hurry about anything -except answering calls of nature; whereas, when I was younger, and

had all the time in the world. theoretically, I was notably impatient.)"

The letter goes on to discuss an installment of "Understandings" -from his description of epic length -recounting his tour in the CCC, from 1934 into 1939 -- that he was working

'I never saw that installment, and in mid '93 I again absented myself from active fandom. When I resumed publishing a little over a year ago, the first mailings to Doc bounced.

'Eventually, through his sister, I found out that, due to diabetes, he had essentially lost his sight, and had been resident in a series of nursing homes. However, through her, he said he'd love to receive what I was publishing -and he did, even though I never heard anything directly. [I'd offered to provide large-print printouts, but that was never responded to.]

'I didn't really expect to hear anything back, again, but -- until this posting, there was always hope. The death, last year, of SaM, Rotsler, and others, was shock enough.

One way or the other, I am going to publish that volume of "Understandings".

'It will contain the twenty installments I ran, plus one additional -relevant -- article, which we had received permission to incorporate.

'I'm going to list the twenty installments -- just to give you an idea of the "range" of Doc's interests.

TWA Flight 800

'WASHINGTON (AP) -- Claims by a retired Navy pilot that two missiles destroyed TWA Flight 800 were disputed immediately by federal investigators.

"We remain unaware of any new evidence that would cause us to reopen our criminal investigation," said FBI spokesman Joseph Valiquette.

William Donaldson, joined at a news conference Monday by former TWA pilots and three eyewitnesses to the July 1996 crash, did not say who he believes fired the missiles, which he claimed exploded just off the left wing of the Boeing 747 jet.

One, he said, was launched from a boat just off the coast of Long Island, N.Y., the other from a second vessel farther south.

The plane exploded as it flew from New York to Paris, killing all 230 aboard.

Donaldson said the FBI and the National Transportation Safety Board, pressured by unidentified, high-ranking U.S. officials, have steered the public toward a theory that the plane's center fuel tank exploded.

"Politicians are interfering at the top. People that should be bubbling the answers from the bottom are silenced." Donaldson said at the conclusion of a nearly four-hour briefing

arranged by Reed Irvine and his conservative group, Accuracy in Media.

The NTSB has not determined the cause of the crash, but it has ruled out a missile strike or a bomb on board. Investigators believe an electrical spark may have ignited the fuel tank.

"Commander Donaldson was wrong when he postulated that Jet-A fuel could not explode. It did. He is wrong today," said Peter Goelz, the board's managing director.

'Retired TWA Capt. Howard Mann, a military accident investigator, and retired TWA Capt. Albert Mundo, who served as flight engineer on the next-to-last flight of the Boeing 747, also spoke at the news conference.'

REG: It's worth noting that to this date the FBI and the NTSB have refused to allow the media, independant investigators---anybody!---to see the wings and engines of Flight TWA 800,

Reportedly an early TV news reporting of the recovery operation by the Navy divers showed one of the engines from the left wing to be heavily damaged. Of course that footage (and the engine) have never been seen again. (and I'm too lazy to go into it deeper), but MY opinion is..."

And I'm aware that getting all the facts available is virtually impossible for 99.9% of the people, and that I am always in a state of opinion flux---always in a limbo of never-enough-info.

7-16-98 'Thank you for TGL #50, which has your excellent review of the video, WACO--The Rules of Engagement. The following is exerpted from my letter to Fostax #175, dated March 22, 1995, and reflects my take on why Waco happened in the first place.

"Talking about l'Affaire Waco, Chares Lipsig theorizes that Clinton might well have authorized the initial raid for the usual evial and paranoid reasons. Well, no. Never mind their motives. The incoming administration hadn't had the time for such plotting. Newly innaugurated, Bill Clinton was far, far too busy to be thinking about the Branch Davidians until he suddenly needed to do some serious damage control. Given that Janet Reno---Clinton's third choice---was nominated for Attorney General on February 11, while the initial BATF attack was on February 28, the Waco standoff was on her plate by the time she was confirmed. Thus, there was no AG in place for Clinton to plot with, nor any Democratic staffers, only Republican incumbents, whom he would have every reason not to trust.

"Any plotting was likely done on a lower level and for some sleazier purpose than demonstrating the awesome power of the US Government to a bunch of gun-nuts. My own belief is that Steve Higgins, then head of BATF, was the deus ex machina of the Waso fiasco. Higgins

was in serious trouble, having been on "60 Minutes" for the second time just before the election, in connection with nonfeasance, his continued failure to act on some real serious sexual harrasment charges filed by female BATF agents. He badly needed something to make him and his agency look good so he wouldn't lose his job. Probably the Branch Davidians had been targetted before the election, just in case, and no, I don't think Bush was consulted, either. Clinton's win just made Higgins's need

to act more urgent.

"Once the wheels had been set in motion, Higgins appears to have rejected the suggestion that Koresh be arrested outside the compound because he was looking to the favorable publicity from the shootout as his salvation. The BATF agent in charge was under pressure to produce, and on the morning of the 28th, he ordered the attack to proceed, even after his inside man reported that Koresh had been tipped off and the advantage of surprise had been lost. Men (and in the event, children) were going to die so that Higgins could keep his job, burt the BATF couldn't wait any longer or the FBI might take the play away from them. This is serious venality and incompetence, yes, and the good old boys lost their gamble; Reno, accepting responsibility for the disaster, eventually accepted Higgins's resignation as well."

'So there is act one. The problem with having a bunch of commandos on the scene is that they tend to come up with commando solutions, which is what they are trained for. You note with shock and horror that after they screwed up big time they destroyed the evidence. Knowing what they had done, the happy warrors of BATF and FBI thus avoided any legal consequences, but two years later there was a major consequence in Oklahoma City, as Tim McVeigh blew up the Murtaugh Building. Did the bombing touch the commandos? Yes. Janet Reno has reduced the overall strength of SWAT teams under her authority by 80 percent. Consider her handling of the Freemen in Justus County, Montana.

REG: Your reconstruction of presumed motives is altogether accurate; it has the characteristic stink of governmental moral and ethical depravity which near absolute power provides to small, fearful, stupid minds.
