The right sources were:
(230) 'Sawley, in fact, deciared at the wedding that "Sercomb was mated to a bullfrog in a sou'wester"'

- Call for the Dead, 1961
(231) 'She used to think of him as the most forgettable man she had ever met; short and plump, with heavy spectacles and thinning hair, he was at first sight the very prototype of an unsuccessful middle-aged bachelor in a sedentary occupation.'
- A Murder of Quality, 1962
(232) 'Standing at the newspaper kiosk, deep in a copy of the Continental Daily Mail, stood a small, frog-like figure in glasses, an earnest, worried liftle man. He looked like a civil servant. Something like that.'
- The Spy Who Came In from the Cold, 1963
(233) "Small, podgy, and at best middle-aged, he was by appearance one of London's meek who do not inherit the earth. His legs were short, his gait anything but agile, his dress costly, ill-fitting, and extremely wet.
