



#### PROGRAM:



## **Fran's Trip Report**

*(yes, it was a long way to go for a filk! But it was worth it!!!)*

I began my pilgrimage rather late in the day, didn't get started till almost noon. I had promised to go to the SFSFS meeting, but wanderlust set in...couldn't wait any longer. There I was, an unaccompanied female on a three to four day drive (I can't tell you how many people asked me, "you're going all by yourself?"). Give me a break! After all, I had my bird to keep me company. It was fun to watch the cars getting ready to pass me on the 4-lane, then slow down to do a double-take. You'd think they'd never seen a bird sitting on a headrest (leaving little unmentionables all over the back of the seat). She was a very attentive companion, especially when I snacked on peanuts. Of course, one never knew what one would find on the back of one's shirt.

I made it to Tulsa in three days (running on adrenaline) just in time to walk in on a rehearsal of the Penguin Players. They have always given the entertainment during the judging of the masquerade at OKon. The puns were flying, the heat was soaring, and Taco Bell was just across the street. They practice at my house (I rent to Roger, a good, fannish friend) because (1) the rooms are large, and (2) Roger is the director. I fit right in, being pretty weirded out and tired.

After spending a few days protecting my bird from Roger's two cats, I was ready to check into our suite at the Camelot. However, the hotel wasn't ready, and wasn't ready, and wasn't ready. It seems the hotel manager fancies himself some kind of programmer and wrote the hotel program instead of buying a commercial product with all the bugs worked out. There was a verrrrry long line in reception all day Friday. I got in line at 5:00 pm, and it only took me half an hour to get my room. However, this was a good time to renew acquaintances. I didn't recognize Robin Bailey at first, 'cause he was disguised as a cowboy. He now sings in a C&W band, and came in his performing get up (I recognized him later when he changed to shorts - great legs).

OKon had more than the usual hotel problems, as the hotel was getting ready to be sold and could care less. Chuck got towels for our suite by calling the janitor at 1:00 am and waking him up. The A/C and maid service were non-existent (except in our suite - Chuck can be very persuasive). The huge Dealers Room was the only function space with A/C by Sunday, as two air conditioners blew up - one over the Art Show (during the Art Auction) - but no harm was done aside from smoke in the air vents.

I didn't attend any of the programming, except the filk concerts, which I video taped - 13 hours of them.

The quality of the music was excellent and varied for all tastes.

OKon has/had a policy of showcasing popular filkers during the day. The after-hours filking grew so large, that people complained they couldn't hear enough of their favorite filkers. The solution was mini-concerts all weekend. I can modestly say my performance went well - one kind lady told me later I didn't sing enough songs - they wanted more. Huge egoboo!

The masquerade has a resounding success. MC David Lee Anderson kept the laughs coming, the costumes were good, and the presentations were well rehearsed. The Penguin Players put on their best performance yet.

The Art Auction brought in lots of money, in spite of the A/C problem. A great deal of the items auctioned were for the charities: Tulsa Senior Services Adult Day Car and Project Get Together.

Closing Ceremonies was long, as there were many OKon Staff to honor - with trophies bearing antennaeed penguins. People were thanked, tears were shed, and OKon was put to bed for the last time. But fandom is alive in Tulsa - there are other cons springing up as you read this.

Monday, Chuck and I visited his mom in Muskogee, then Tuesday he flew back to Ft. Laud. I spent the rest of the time cleaning a very dusty attic, visiting family and celebrating Tisha's 22nd birthday (they sure grow up fast, don't they?).

The drive back was an anti-climax. I wasn't in the mood for camping as I originally planned. Just too tired. It took me four days to drive back - there wasn't a con at the end of the road (sigh).

Lessons learned: (1) always ask for the non-smoking rooms of cheap motels, especially if you need to rehearse for a pending concert (hack, hack, koff, koff). (2) Don't forget your towel (to cover the carseat). And (3) take lots of peanuts.




