STEVE STILES WINS TAFF RACE: Steve Stiles, youthful New York fanartist, has won out over two other fans in the Trans-Atlantic Fan Fund Competition. Stiles will travel to the 1968 British National SF Convention (ThirdManCon) which will be held in Manchester, England over Easter Weekend.
