# RULES OF SAPS

## OFFICERS

The Official Editor is elected by a ballot of the membership and shall handle all official duties. He will appoint an Emergency Officer. All other members shall be appointed vice presidents.

## ELECTION

An election shall be held each year on the occasion of the first mailing.

## ACTIVITY

Each member shall submit his dues on time, and must submit six or more pages of duplicated matter (three or more pages must be written matter) in any period of two consecutive mailings.

Pages of material may be credited to a member other than the publisher.

A page shall be defined as being approximately  $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$

Reprint material will be given  $\frac{1}{2}$  credit if more than two years old.

Material shall be in accordance with postal regulations and the editor may withhold any material he considers obscene or in poor taste.

Material distributed prior to the deadline shall not receive credit. Credited material, however, may be distributed seven days after the mailing deadline; regardless of whether the mailing has been shipped.

## MEMBER-SHIP

The group shall consist of thirty-five members. New members shall be recruited from the waiting list.

## WAITING LIST

When the membership is filled the OE shall inform a prospective member of this and put his name on the waiting list. Waiting listers shall receive a copy of the Spectator & must inform the OE of their intentions after each mailing.

## DUES

Dues shall be \$2.00 for four mailings and the OE may assess members 50% when expenses rise unreasonably.

## MAILING DEADLINES

Material intended for a mailing must reach the OE before the deadline. The deadlines shall be the fifteenth of January, April, July, and October.

Surplus mailings shall be sold for \$1 each to members on the waiting list.

## MORALS

It shall be considered immoral to hang the OE before completion of his term of office.
