## RULES

1. MEMBERSHIP: Limited to 36 members, Married couples may be considered one membership and still receive activity credit and voting privileges separately.
2. ACTIVITY: Each member must contribute at least six quarto pages of original material in any period of two consecutive mailings, to be sent to the Official Editor in an edition of at least 42 copies (43 copies, to provide UCLA with a copy for their SF collection, would be appreciated.) Anyone sending less than 42 copies will be fined one mailing's worth of dues, in addition to having to furnish the remainder of the required copies before credit is allowed. Reprints or priorly-distributed material does not count for credit. Use of your own artwork may count up to three pages of credit out of the six, use of someone else's artwork only up to one page. The OE will be the only judge of whether a page is worth full credit. Postmailings are not credited, and are grotched at loudly, even when they're from the OE, as they often are.
3. DUES: \$2.00 per year, payable before the deadline of the last mailing in your current membership year.
4. WAITING LIST: When no openings exist in the membership, applicants will be placed on a waiting list in order of application. Members of the waiting

list must acknowledge receipt of the SPECTATOR, as evidence of continued interest in membership, within one month of the mailing, in order to retain their places on the waiting list. Time extensions are granted to overseas Wlers. A fee of \$1 will be charged for admission to the waiting list, payable to the OE within one month of the mailing in which you first appear on the WL. This fee is applied to the first year's dues as a member, but is not refundable to dropouts. On being invited to join, a Wler must contribute the remaining dues and 6 pages minimum activity before the next mailing deadline. Declining an offered membership and returning to the bottom of the WL will result in a 50¢ fine, deducted from the WL fee and not refundable.

5. OFFICERS: The Official Editor makes all the rules and conducts all the business. All materials for a mailing must be in his hands by the 15th of January, April, July, or October. 42 identical mailings are assembled for distribution to the members, and - on an availability basis - to the Wlers. The charge for a mailing sent to a Wler is 25¢ per hundred pages or substantial fraction thereof (\$1 minimum). Any Wler wishing to circulate his zine in the mailing may do so at a cost of 25¢ per sheet (2 pages). The OE is elected every year at the January mailing, and takes office after the April mailing.

The President of SAPS is a titular office granted the member placing highest in the annual Pillar Poll, a laureate poll based on mailings of the previous year and also distributed with the January mailing.

All other members of SAPS are titular vice-presidents. An Emergency Officer is appointed to take over if the OE is unable to fulfill his duties, and the OE may appoint other officers at whim.

6. IMMORALITY: It is immoral to miss a mailing, and that goes for Armistead, Eklund, Hannifen, Lewis, and Metcalf this time. It is also immoral to wait and get dropped rather than resign and let someone have a chance at your membership: wherefore Carr, Anderson, Crilly and Ellern are also immoral.
7. STUPIDITY: It is extremely stupid not to read all of the SPECTATOR.

NOTE WELL: WAITING-LISTERS must acknowledge the SPECTATOR by 20 November.  
 INVITEES must get an acceptance in by 20 November and dues and activity in by 15 January.  
 MEMBERS must get activity and dues in by 15 January.
