In accordance with the suggestions by a large number of members, the membership is being lowered gradually back to its original limit of 30. This will be done by admitting waitlisters to half of the available positions until the roster is reduced to 30. Thus, with one or two vacancies, one WLER will be admitted, with three or four vacancies, two will be admitted, etc. Should this reduction fail in revitalizing the organization, the 36-member limit will again be reinstated, but it should have a year of trial, first, after which the current OE may decide its results.

RULES

1. Membership: Limited to 35 members. Married couples may be considered one membership and still receive activity credit and voting privileges separately.

2. Activity: Each member must contribute at least 6 quarto pages of his own material in any period of 2 consecutive mailings, to be sent to the OE in an edition of at least 42 copies (43, to provide UCLA with a copy for their SF collection, would be appreciated). Anyone sending in less than 42 copies will be fined one mailing's worth of dues, in addition to having to furnish the remainder of the required copies before credit is allowed. Reprints or priorly-dis-

tributed material do not count for credit. Your own art may count up to 3 pages of credit out of the 6, or someone else's art may count up to 1 page. The OE will be the only judge of whether a page is worth full credit. Postmailings will not be credited.

3. Dues: \$2 per year, payable before the deadline of your last paid-up mailing, as indicated in the SPECTATOR.

4. Waiting List: When no openings exist in the roster, applicants will be placed on a waiting list in order of application. The Wlers must acknowledge receipt of the SPECTATOR, as evidence of continuing interest in membership, within one month of the mailing, in order to retain their places on the list. Time extensions will be granted to Wlers overseas. A \$1 fee will be charged for admission to the WL, payable to the OE within 1 month of the time your name appears on the WL. This fee is applicable to the first year's dues as a member, but is not refundable. On being invited to join, a Wler must contribute the remaining dues and 6 pages minimum activity before the next mailing. Declining an invitation to membership to return to the bottom of the WL will result in a 50¢ fine.

5. Officers: The Official Editor makes all the rules and conducts all the business. All materials for a mailing must be in his hands by the 15th of Jan, Apr, July, or Oct. 42 identical mailings are assembled for distribution to the members, and - on an availability basis - to the Wlers for 25¢/100 pages or substantial portion thereof (\$1 min.) The OE is elected each year at the January mailing, and takes office after the April mailing.

The President is a titular office granted the member placing highest in the annual Pillar Poll, a laureate poll based on mailings of the previous year, and also circulated with the January mailing.

All other members are titular Vice-Presidents; an Emergency Officer is appointed to take over if the OE is unable to fulfill his duties, and the OE may appoint other officers at whim.

6. Immorality, etc.: It is immoral to miss a mailing-- so Carr, Castora, K. Hulan, Lichtman are immoral this time. It is extremely stupid not to read all of the SPECTATOR.

NOTE WELL: Wlers must acknowledge the SPECTATOR by 20 November (Blum and Brandon have until 1 January.)

Members must get activity in by 15 January.

Candidates for OE must file with the current OE by 10 Jan.
