Waiting list members must get their acknowledgement of the OO and of their continued interest in SAPS to DAVE HULAN by June 10, 1967.

All dues and business connected with the next mailing must be sent to Dave Hulan.

DAVID HULAN WILL TAKE OVER AS OE OF SAPS ON RECEIPT OF THIS MAILING BY THE MEMBERS.

Rules of Saps(subject to change or amendment by David Hulan)

1. 30 Bundles will be sent out to the membership. Married couples may be considered one member, but can, if they both equal individual membership requirements, be given separate activity credit and voting rights. If less than individual requirements are furnished by one, it shall be up to the judgement of the OE as to the validity of that membership. At least one of the couple must do full requirements.
2. A member is required to furnish at least 6 pages of his own material in any period of two consecutive mailings. No rerprints or post mailings accepted for page credit, nor will post mailings be allowed any status under normal conditions. At least 36 copies of this zine must be sent to the OE and those 36 copies must get there by the deadline.
3. Deadlines will be set by the OE and will normally fall in the months of July, October, January and April. Exact date of the deadline will be given on the first page of the OO.
4. Dues are \$2 a year payable before the fourth mailing of your membership as listed next to your name in the OO.
5. WLsters must acknowledge receipt of the Spectator by the designated date given for such acknowledgement; must pay \$1.00 on joining the WL, and must send the other \$1. plus a minimum of 6 creditable pages by the next deadline after he receives his invitation.

Extra mailings will be sent to WL members at 25¢/100 pages(\$1.00 minimum)for as long as they last. Some effort will be made to give invitees a bundle, but after that it is a fight. WL members can only order the next mailing(or any left over current one, and cannot build up credit in advance.

6. The OE is elected in the January mailing and assumes control after the April mailing is sent out. The OE makes and is the law of SAPS and runs the organization as best he dares.

The OE can create any offices he feels needed, with the exception of the President of Saps. The President of SAPS is the member who gets the most votes on the annual Pillar Poll. The Pillar Poll will also be circulated in the January mailing.

7. The president of SAPS has no duty, except that of having won the previous SAPS Poll.
8. All members of SAPS except the OE and President are Vice Presidents of SAPS, which gives them the right of insurrection(in a body) They also share, with the president and any OE who might be that foolish, the right to become OE at some future date, possibly when they least expect it.
9. A further duty of the membership is to check the OO and any possible zine Mr. Hulan may have carefully to see what changes may have been made in all this. The present OE will not be held totally responsible for any goofs made from following this OO if the rules are/outmoded.

Voting in the Pillar Poll were: Ballard, J & R Berman, E & F Busby, Cox, Eney, Foyster, Hulan, Jacobs, Katz, Kusske, A & N Rapp, Toskey, J Webbert; 16 in all, two of whom did not vote for OE. Berry, Metcalf and D Webbert voted for OE only.

Our Pop Ten Wlrs, voted by 11 persons, are: 1. Weber, 2. Atkins, 3. Murray, 4. Mann, 5. Pfeifer, 6. Stevens, 7. Staton, 8. Smith, 9. Lewis, and 10. Dupree. J Webbert came close even though he is a member, and thus in double jeopardy or something. Like maybe kidding...

The SAPS Popularity Contest: Art Rapp pointed out that my scoring system allowed prolific voters to put in too many points, and he was right. In return he suggested a system that could have allowed one voter to give his buddy no less than 2nd place (though this didn't happen, while by my system two voters put in most of the points). So I scored by both systems and by 3 intermediate systems that gave nothing but intermediate results. The overall result is that [since each system coincidentally had a 3-way tie for 10th place] SAPS' Pop Ten is 17 people: besides your top ten in the Pillar Poll TOTALS column, SAPS dearly loves Bailes, Cox; Devore, Eklund, Fitch, Patten and Toskey [and I put them into alphabetical order; you didn't]. Only 8 voted this experimental category, and while I think it was worth trying once, just to \*see\*, I don't think it is worthwhile trying it again. We can get the same result by not being too proud to borrow a good idea from FAPA: the "Favorite Unsung.." category, which is what Miscellaneous has been tending-toward for several years. Comments exceed space here: the main thing is that Voters are neglecting the categories of Verse, Artwork and Fiction: on 16 ballots, 48% of Art points were voted, 60% for verse and 73% for fiction, as compared to over 90% for Zines, MCs and Articles, & 82% for Humor. Some re-evaluation seems in order.

Sorry to have to omit the 7 comments; there were some good ones.

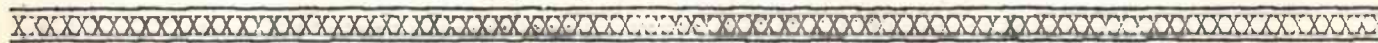
