MY FIRST

N BECOMING a member of N'APA I find myself for the first time publishing my first fan magazine. True I've been one of the editors and publishers of SCience-Fiction Times for over three years, but never before have I published a whole fan magazine by myself. My thanks to N'APA for being instrumental in doing this.

For N'APA, I've decided to discuss and report on Science-Fiction pocket books, as I'm not only doing this for Science-Fiction Times, but feel that NAPA members will be interested in this phase of science-fiction; especially the collectors of science-fiction pocket books.

I will reprint in this issue the January, February, a n d March 1960 column, "The Science-Fiction Pocket Book Report", which gives exact dates and other information of all the science-fiction pocket books that have come out in the United States since Kanuary 1st. The April, May, and June columns will be reprinted in my next issue.

During April the latest two Galaxy Novel pocket books, distributed thru the Beacon Books set-up hit an extreme low in science-fiction. Not since the days of Red Circle's Marvel Stories have such sex stories masquarading as science - fiction appeared on the newsstands. While not being above enjoying such stories, I find the science-fiction reader part of me agast as having even the slight mention of what remains of the good name science-fiction even being remotely connected with such stories. While not wanting to deny anyone from making money, why can't Mr. Guinn and Mr. Gold just publish sex pocket books and not louse up science-fiction. Next thing you know they'll be publishing "Western Science-Fiction", "Detect ive Science-Fiction", "Sports Science-Fiction", etc, etc, etc. Thank God that the mention of science-fiction is very minute in both these volumes. Many readers and fans will no doubt pass them up thinking they are (what they actually are) sex novels. The only reason I was able to find them, was that I was looking for the Galaxy Novels, and that they are by known science-fiction authors. In case by now you are dying to read them, they are: "FLESH" by Jose Farmer and "SEX WAR" (formerly "White Widows") by ex-editor Sam Merwin. Of the two books, Farmer's novel is the more sexier, with the science-fiction background hanging by less than a mere spider's In Merwin's novel, the science-fiction story is still there, but it has been web. sex-padded for the market. While Merwin's novel is better reading because the se x is added expecially for this publication, Farmer's novel is an original for this series and shows what to expect in future novels of this sexed-over so called science-fiction pocket books. We understand that the policy of this series is not the makings of Guinn or Gold, but of the Beacon Book people, who believe that only sex in any literary field will sell. Better this series dies as a science-fiction ser-

ies than continue as is. While I deplore the use of science-fiction theme in Farmer's novel, I enjoyed the story.

Some of the enjoyable recent science-fiction pocket-books have been: "Slavers Of Space" by John Brunner and "Doctor Futurity" by Philip K. Dick, both appearing in Ace's double novel books #D-421; "The Sound Of His Horn" by Sarbin published by Ballantine Books #337K, "Get Out Of My Sky" selected by Leo Margulies, Crest Books, #S362; "The Aliens" by Murray Leinster, Berkley Medallin, #G410; and "Island In The Sky" by Arthur C. Clarke, Signet Books, #S1769.
