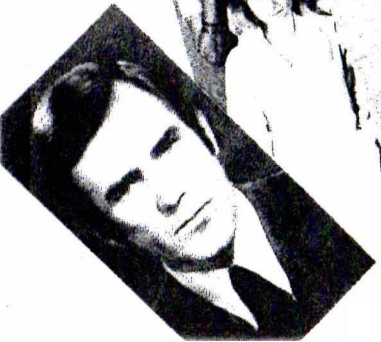

REMEMBER THE SEVENTIES?

It seems like just yesterday, but eight years have passed since the end of that turbulent decade. I saw Nixon's resignation, the end of the Vietnam War, the beginning of the Afghanistan war, the Whitlam Government, the dismissal of the Whitlam Government, the Fraser LCP Government, Cyclone Tracey, The Munich Olympics, the Westgate Bridge disaster (Living in Footscray now, I can see the bridge, now safely completed) the overthrow of the Allende Government in Chile (That I cannot forgive -- did you know that the Spanish version of Allen is Allende?) and the introduction of Colour T.V. in Australia.

I was at school when the decade began and working when it ended, so I went through a lot of personal changes. In retrospect, a lot of things seemed very bright and flashy. I remember flares and platforms, skinheads and sharpies, Garish T.V. when "Dressing for colour" mean't as loud, contrasting and checked as possible. I remember talking my literature class teacher into an excursion to see "Star Wars", as an example of Fantasy. Ah nostalgia.

It seems strange that it was so long ago. What we have left is some buildings, like the B.H.P. House in Melbourne (It was described as a big black block when it was built) some T.V. repeats (M.A.S.H., The Sullivans - which was huge at one time, The Young Doctors, When the boat comes in) and lots of Music. The seventies were when Glam Rock, Heavy Metal and Punk were invented, all of them quite outrageous.. It was a time of reaction, when taste and fashion were often loud and flashy. It was also a time of oil price shocks, when O.P.E.C. used its muscles for the first time. Nothing was quite the same in the seventies.
