John Litchen

Bruce says: John Litchen sent me digital copies of the photos he took of John Bangsund and Sally Yeoland, while making a third Aussiefan film during his and Monica's honeymoon in Canberra, Queen's Birthday Weekend, June 1973. A few of these photos appear in SFC 103, and elsewhere. John later sent me the photos he took during the shoots for all three Aussiefan films. Two of the films can be seen on YouTube. John has just rediscovered his print of the third film:

John Litchen says:

I was looking through the boxes in which I keep my 16mm movies. I discovered I do have the only copy of the short colour film.


Not only that, when Merv closed Space Age Books and moved what was left over to his house, he gave me the copies of the films he had which were the original work print and the master edited version used by the film lab to make the release copies that went overseas. Included in that were the magnetic sound track made by the lab and a marked up copy for synchronizing the image and sound. That is all I thought I had.

But what is even more remarkable is that there is also a copy of the second film made in Sydney which I never knew I had. I was sure they kept whatever copies were made. They must have given their copy to Merv and he put it with the other films. I have them all here. limagine the work print and the master copies are reasonably pristine, while the prints used for projection over time in the USA will most likely show wear and tear. Any ideas about what in the future should be done to maintain preservation of these films? They are after all, valuable items of fan history in Australia.

I just thought you should know that they exist. I was quite excited to discover the missing colour short film and the copy of the Sydney film.


