

'According to one of those old fanzines I'm clearly addicted to (*Focal Point* V2 #5 if you must know) the first issue of *The Comet* was published in May 1930. *The Comet* is generally considered to be the very first science fiction fanzine. Which means May 2005 will be the 75th anniversary of fanzine fandom. I thought I'd mention this as those of you with an interest in fanzines might care to do something by way of celebration.'

And next August will be the 37th anniversary of the first mailing of ANZAPA, but that announcement doesn't have quite the same ring to it. August this year was the twentieth anniversary of the first publication of *The Metaphysical Review*, which hasn't appeared recently. Meanwhile, the man who inadvertently made possible the publication of *TMR* and the revival of *SFC*, Brian McCurdy (he set up the scheme at Macmillan Education Australia by which I freelanced for a guaranteed monthly income for 12 years) died on Tuesday, 16 November at the age of 67. He was a Good Man.
