THE CONSTITUTION OF ANZAPA

1. The Australian and New Zealand Amateur Publishing Association (ANZAPA) is an association of people whose common interest is amateur journalism. Its purpose is to facilitate communication between its members through a bi-monthly exchange of publications.

2. <u>Membership</u> Membership is limited to thirty persons or couples. On joining, a member shall be required to pay a pro rata membership and contribute to the following mailing. If there are no vacancies, applicants for membership will be placed on a waiting list.

3. Activity To retain membership a member must contribute a minimum of six quarto pages of self-written material every six months. Contributions must be supplied to the Official Editor in cditions of thirty-five substantially identical copies.

A publication apparently intended to circulate widely outside ANZAPA in addition to ANZAPA will not be counted towards a member's minimum activity requirements, unless it bears conspicuously on its cover or front page the words 'First published in ANZAPA' or words to similar effect and the name and address of the member on whose behalf credit is sought.

4 <u>Mailings</u> Aulling dates shall the the tenth of the months of Februar: April, June, August, October, December. Mailing deadlines may be announced by the Official Editor. With each mailing, the Official Editor shall publish an official organ, including a list of the contents, a membership roster, and a financial statement. ¹⁴aterial which violates postal regulations shall not be included. The Official Editor chall publish this Constitution in the official organ at least once a year.

5. Fees Members are required to pay an annual fee of \$7.00 on or before the first of August.

6. Officers of the Association A President shall be elected annually by means of a popularity poll (called 'Anzapopoll'). The resident's duties shall be to organize the following poll and to 'encourage' les autres''.

An Official Editor shall be elected (or re-elected) annually. The Official Editor shall be an Australian resident. The duthes of the Official Editor shall include distributing the mailings, publiching the official organ, and controlling the Association's finances. Other duties may be undertaken at the Official Editor's siscretion.

An Emergency Offi or may be appointed by the Official Editor to perform any of the Official Editor's dutice.

7. Elections The ballot for the election of the Official Editor, containing the names of all those who have been nominated for the office, shall be distributed with the February mailing. The closing date shall be the 10th of March or twentyeight days after the February mailing has been distributed. The counting of votes shall be conducted by a member not standing for offic Elections shall be by simple majority. The result shall be announced in the April official organ and the incoming Official ditor shall assume duties with the June mailing. The Anzapopoll shall be conducted by the President in conjunction with the august mailing. The incoming President shall assume office with the October mailing.

8. <u>Amendments</u> Proposed amendments to the Constitution shall be submitted in writing to the Official Editor, bearing the signatures of three members. These amendments shall be set 1 out in the official organ for the mailing immediately following their reception by the Official Editor. With the second mailing foll following their reception, the Official Editor shall distribute a ballot. The closing date for the return of ballots shall be twenty-eight days after the mailing has been distributed. Any amendment receiving a positive vote from a majority of members shall be passed.

9. <u>Special rules</u> Special rules may be adopted at any time, provided a majority of voters endorses a copy of the proposed rule within twenty-eight days of its distribution. Such a proposed must be distributed to the entire membership at substantially the same time. Any member other than the proposer(s) may be nominated to count votes.

THE OBE RULES, OK?

- 1. When in doubt, do what the OBE says and argue <u>afterwards</u>; remember Carey dandfield, Paul Anderson, Christine & Derrick Ashby, etc., etc.
- 2. The constitution states clearly that dues are dues on or before i August. On that date only members 1-16 had paid. Subsequently Smith, Fraser, Irown, Grigg, Ashbys and O'Brien sent contributions, paid, or whatever. There being 10 waitlisters, they immediately had priority over ex-members, but four places were left even after making provision for them, so Smith, Fraser, Brown and Grigg were treated as the most recent waitlisters who, by chance, managed to get their cohtributions in early and so became instant members. Communications from Edwards, etc., followed. The Ashby & O'Brien stuff awaits their instructions.
- 3. This goes out a day late. The date of arrival of the last few contributions helps to explain this. Not <u>early</u> on the 10th, either.
- I don't mind running off member's contributions if they advise me in advance of their needs, and give me tame to do the job.
 Watch it, "eith Taylor.
- 5. I purchased Jiffy bags in the hope that members would re-use them, so that we would save all round and mailings would arrive in better condition, and so on. Thank you to the few who did re-use the bags. And try harder this time. (The Presidents, I might note, sent their contribution in an ordinary envelope which arrived, like so many of its class, in shr eds, but in their case it was also satined with blood, jelly, or plum jam.)
- 6. It is quite clear that many members and former waitlisters don't hother to read the 00. That s ok, but dumb. The duties of the official editor don't extend so far as saving the memberships of members who don't bother to check up on what is expected of them. IT'S YOUR MEMBERSHIP you worry about it, not me.
- 7. Support the Presidents by voting in the ANZAPOPOLL, keep the cards and letters rolling in, and get your stuff here by October 14.
