

Wicked: the Life and Times of the Wicked Witch of the West (1995) by G. Maguire. Book Review by Leana Justice

We're in Oz; it's OK to have sex with consenting Animals. I found not a single memorable quote in the novel. I did, however, finish reading, doubtless driven by morbid curiosity. Maguire successfully humanizes the 'wicked witch,' or Elphaba to family and a few college friends. She is a political dissident during the Wizard's usurpation of the infant Ozma's throne. Characters and brief subplots are drawn from Baum's novels (gnome king, southern marshes), but Maguire enriches OZ by forcing characters to operate within social, religious and political arenas. Elphaba uses the title 'witch' to tap land's powerful religious mythologies, layers of disparate religions heaped into the citizen's lives by propaganda, political decisions from Emerald City, and traveling clerics. The title 'witch' grants Elphaba immediate power/authority during a succession of critical conflicts, power that she fails to use correctly or quickly enough to win her way. 'Witch' is a pseudonym the protagonist assumes despite her very limited magical powers.

Ultimately *Wicked* is a novel of one individual's failures. Elphaba fails to (1) finish college (2) have a happy sex life (3) overthrow the Wizard (4) be a good mother (5) save her sister - now called the Wicked Witch of the East- or feel sorry she died (6) make her Dad love her (7) get her sister's shoes (8) get forgiveness from a wronged woman (9) help Munchkinland secede (10) rescue her 'adoptive' family (11) stop Dorothy (12) protect her pets/familiars from Dorothy.

After this novel, you will experience a heaviness of limbs and heart. Score: B-

The following reviews are by me.

Crypto-nomicon by Neal Stephenson

I enjoyed reading this very long book that weaves a story based on lots of semi-historical events in World World II and a modern day techno-thriller. The ride is worth the price of admission though the climax is mild. Computer geeks should enjoy this. History buffs might also enjoy the literary license on true events. I rate this book an "A-".

Dune: House Corrino by Brain Herbert and Kevin J. Anderson

The third book in the *Dune: House* trilogy was quite enjoyable. It wraps up all the plot lines of the two other books nicely and culminates with the birth of Paul

Atreides. I enjoyed the pacing and the insight into the back history leading up to *Dune* (one of my favorite novels). Some of the violence/action is rather dark but this is keeping with the tragic nature of most of the characters. I rate this book an A.

Spectrum 9: The Best In Contemporary Fantastic Art. Cathy Fenner and Arnie Fenner, Editors

This volume was beautiful as always. I could live without the overt political commentaries in the front (reviewing the years events) though. Standalone, I rate this book an A. In comparison to pervious volumes, I rate it as a B.

Dilbert and the Way of the Weasel by Scott Adams

I am a Scott Adams disciple. He is my prophet. I laughed over and over reading this and then I was very depressed when I was done as I realized that I was essentially laughing about a major component of my life (my work environment). This is a humor-writing book about work (and people) that Adams sums up as a new simple theory: "people are weasels". Then the next 348 pages are filled with examples and related Dilbert cartoons. I rate this book as an A-.
