#### VACATION




Hey, Dwarfs, Look Behind You!






A "Furry" Fan in Costume (Persona)

Plus the eye candy was glorious. I give it a fan boy grade of A. The third film has to be the Dark Phoenix saga.

The Matrix: Rebloated was disappointing. Oh, I enjoyed it and realize it had impossible expectations to live up to (since the first movie was the epitome of human artist endeavor to date). However, where the first movie was tight, where every line. every scene, every action contributed to the movie, the second was a loose buffet of bigger is better, longer is cooler, etc. The second movie could have used a lot of rewriting to make it tighter and cut out about 25 minutes of dragging scenes and dialog. Even the action scenes could have been tighten up significantly. There are a lot of scenes and characters and dialog that had me asking, "why is this here?" I could nitpick all day but I would only depress you and myself. Hopefully, the third movie will make use of these loose plot threads and aimless characters and redeem them a little. I like the way it ended thematically, with the idea that all bets are off now. The prophecy is done (and may have never been anything but a contrivance of the Matrix to begin with). There were some nice ironies to the first movie too. Agent Smith calls humans a virus in the first movie and becomes one himself in the second. Morpheus asks Neo what if everything you believed was a lie in the first movie and it may be that everything he believed was exposed as a lie in the second movie. So I liked the movie, it had potential but is a rough unpolished semi-precious stone where the first film was a perfect cut diamond. I give it a C+ that may be upgraded to a B- depending on the backlight of the third film. (X)
