OBITUARY Harold Palmer Piser, B.S.F.A. member of several years' standing, died recently in New York where he lived.

His main interest in the field was bibliographical, particularly in connection with the many amateur magazines ("fanzines") published by sf and fantasy readers. Retired and in his seventies, he energetically pursued his ambition to publish a complete checklist of these magazines, their editors, contributors, etc. Given a few more years, he might well have achieved it.

Instead, it is understood that his lawyer has, acting on his instructions, caused his accumulated notes and files to be destroyed. Which is all that is at present known of the matter.

The result of the Trans-Atlantic Fan Fund Poll has been declared. Eddie Jones of Liverpool (well, Bootle, then) has beaten Belfast author Bob Shaw in a world-wide poll amongst sf fans and will therefore travel to the St Louis World S.F.
