THE INTERNATIONAL CONTACTS DEPARTMENT REPORTS: It was said by John Donne that "no manne is an islande, entire of itselfe." The same could be applied to SF fandom. We have in Great Britain been far too content to worry about our own problems, to live in our own little world of fandom having contacts with the United States and perhaps Australia, and disregarding science fiction and science fiction fandom anywhere else in the world. British insularity is a well-known phenomenon, and by now, surely, out of date. The days have ceased when we can disregard other countries. SF fandom, of course, which tends to look to the past rather than to the future (an anomaly that was noted by Nicholas Tomalin in the "Atticus" Sunday Times report upon the

Worldcon) is as so often happens not in the forefront of progress.

The International Contacts Department has been formed to counteract this insular tendency. I have already contacted many of the SF groups of the Continent and the Americas, and hope soon to establish a regular correspondence with the leading lights of these groups. I will exchange information with them on the SF situation in Britain, and our Secretary will be sending them copies of each issue of VECTOR; in return, I will get information and their own official journal or fanzine which approximates to such a rank. There are some countries, for instance Belgium and Argentina, where fans are still trying to form SF groups; without appearing to act too much in the manner of a Palmerston, I think that we, the B.S.F.A., can help these fans - first of all by telling them of our own system of organisation (the B.S.F.A., one can say without boasting, is possibly the best-organised national SF association in the world), and secondly by giving personal encouragement.

Personal contact is an element very necessary in removing the barriers between countries. If anyone wishes to write to fans in Europe I will be glad to give addresses. There are many who write and understand English very well, though of course if you are willing to write or to receive letters in a foreign language you will be much more in demand as a correspondent:
