PETER WESTON

THIS YEAR'S FAN GUEST OF HONOUR AT HELICON, JERSEY, TALKS ABOUT CONVENTIONS, AVOIDING GETTING DRUNK. HUM-AND-SWAY SESSIONS AND HOW TO BECOME A SECRET MASTER OF FANDOM

You thought you knew it all? Hah! No way. Peter Weston will introduce you to the part of being a science fiction fan that other fans don't reach.

Reportedly a robot built by the original Birmingham SF Group in the early 60s, he appeared almost overnight with no known history and immediately caused a storm in British fandom. This man didn't take prisoners. Immediately seeing that British fanzines were full of every subject except science fiction he set out to Change the World. If you were a science fiction fan, you talked about SCIENCE FICTION, dammit! fanzine ZENITH His SPECULATION - became THE 'zine SCIENCE for all self-respecting

JUNE Meeting - Fantasy author Juliet E McKenna will be talking to the Group.

FICTION fans, containing articles by many famous SF authors such as Frederik Pohl and H Beam Piper among others. In the mid-sixties he wrote a fan column for the BSFA's official journal VECTOR under the pseudonym 'Malcolm Edwards', two full years before the REAL Malcolm Edwards entered British fandom. His foresight was extraordinary.

In 1971, along with Vernon Brown, Bob Rickard and myself, he organised the Eastercon in Worcester, with Anne McCaffrey as Guest of Honour. Three months later, Peter, Vernon and myself started the Birmingham SF Group that is still running now - 31 years on!

He went on to greater glory by being Chairman of a British WorldCon - not once, but twice! How did he manage all this activity? Had he cloned himself? Was there no end to this man's energy and enthusiasm?

But, sadly, there was. All positronic robots have to be recharged and the Weston Mark-PR model was no exception. Dropping out of fandom and the Brum Group after a 25-year plus stint, nothing was heard of him until he visited the Brum Group last year. News of his re-entry into fandom spread quickly and he was invited to be Fan Guest of Honour at this year's Eastercon in Jersey.

And now - fully recharged and ready to attain even greater heights - Peter is back and we welcome him to the Group to talk about his life in fandom, how he feels about his return and how he succeeded in shedding off the problems of rust.

NEWS IN BRIEF

.... Kim Stanley Robinson's new epic, THE YEARS OF RICE AND SALT, has been published as a HarperCollins general fiction title, not, as originally planned, in their 'Voyager' imprint. Apparently it was decided that this book is NOT science fiction and would therefore appeal to a much wider

audience. The novel is an alternate history of the last 600 years in which the Plague has wiped out the whole of Europe. Of course that's not science fiction!??? the Philip K Dick Award for best original paperback SF in 2001 was awarded to published SHIP OF FOOLS by Richard Paul Russo (Ace books, US) Five Star Books in the US have announced a new series edited by Martin H Greenberg focusing on shorter fiction, The first four titles were announced for March 2002 publication - IMMERSION AND OTHER SHORT NOVELS by Gregory Benford, HUNTING THE SNARK AND OTHER SHORT NOVELS by Mike Resnick, BEHIND THE EYES DREAMERS AND SHORT NOVELS by Pamela Sargent and IN ANOTHER COUNTRY AND OTHER SHORT NOVELS by Robert Silverberg. They are published mainly for the library market so may be difficult to get but ANDROMEDA will certainly be trying to get them in Graham Joyce's magnificent novel THE TOOTH FAIRY is being reissued by Earthlight, and Radar Pictures have optioned the novel for a movie with the screenplay to be written by Graham. His new novel, THE FACTS OF LIFE, has been sold to Gollancz Fred Saberhagen has sold a new Berserker novel BERSERKER PRIME to Tor Robert Rankin moves from Transworld/Doubleday to Gollancz. The first novel has been handed in - it's called THE HOLLOW **CHOCOLATE** BUNNIES OF THE APOCALYPSE Meisha Merlin are to publish an omnibus volume of the first two Kedrigern novels and six short stories

ANDROMEDA IS BACK!

Yes, ANDROMEDA is back and now open for business at its usual premises 2-5 Suffolk Street. The assets of the old company (Andromeda Book Co Ltd.) were bought for an undisclosed sum on April 19th by Boomclear Ltd who are based in Walsall and who also own DUNGEONS AND STARSHIPS in Digbeth. The shop opened the next day.

The new name is ANDROMEDA BOOKSHOPS LTD. I have been appointed manager and eventually all the staff will be re-employed. After three months closure, it will obviously take some time to get up to speed again. But new stock is now being ordered and the shelf-refilling will commence, hopefully, next week. About 40 boxes that had been stuck in New York have now arrived and are on the shelves. At present, it is not known if we will be staying in Suffolk Street. The lease ran out on April 19th but the new owners have obtained a short extension and are negotiating for a longer term.

Alternatively, we may be combined with DUNGEONS AND STARSHIPS in new, bigger premises in the City centre. It will be ironic if that happens as DUNGEONS AND STARSHIPS was started in ANDROMEDA's basement over 25 years ago!

By the time the third book was published, the first two were out of print. Book 2 was reprinted - but not Book 1! Without the first volume available, the sales dropped quickly. This type of thing is happening all too frequently with non-interested staff at publishers relying completely on computers Paramount have optioned film rights to the 8-book series The Lost Regiment by William R Forstchen There's a new Hammer's Slammers novel by David Drake due in July - PAYING THE PIPER will be a \$23.00 hardcover Ace books have repurchased the Liaden Universe series by Sharon Lee and Steve Miller. They originally published three of the series nearly 20 years ago. Since then, the series has attained cult status and a further five volumes (2 preguels and 3 sequels) have appeared in hardcover. Volume 1 - LOCAL CUSTOM - was published in March and Vol 2 -SCOUT'S PROGRESS appeared April 30th. The other volumes will appear at quarterly intervals R A Lafferty died in March, aged 87. His novels included PAST MASTER, ARRIVE AΤ EASTERWINE and FOURTH MANSIONS Jack Williamson celebrated his 94th birthday on April 29th Dave Langford has received NESFA's Edward E Smith Memorial Imaginative 'Skylark' Award for Fiction Katherine Kurtz has resold the original Deryni trilogy - DERYNI RISING, DERYNI CHECKMATE and HIGH DERYNI - to Ace. One wonders

what the Del Rey editors are thinking of, letting these books go. Yes, they're 30 years old but they have never been out of print until last year. They've sold steadily and have been good income for Del Rey. All three books will be revised to bring them in line with later books in the series. If you ONLY read SF I really can recommend this series this is fantasy worth reading - all the 'magic' can easily be read teleportation, etc., - good old science fiction themes! In June, Tor are about to prove that hardcovers of old paperbacks DO sell by issuing A STAINLESS STEEL TRIO by Harry Harrison - a hardcover omnibus of STAINLESS STEEL RAT IS BORN,GETS DRAFTED and ...SINGS THE BLUES. Plus hardcover editions of L Sprague de Camp & Lin Carter's CONAN THE LIBERATOR and Gordon R Dickson's DORSAI SPIRIT (presumably SPIRIT DORSAI and LOST DORSAI) Baen books are about to issue (in August) **MEDSHIP** by Murray Leinster. This will be (hopefully) the four Med Ship books in one volume. I say hopefully because over a decade ago issued THE COMPLETE MEDSHIP and missed out one book! The four volumes are DOCTOR TO THE STARS (the missing volume!), WORLD IS TABOO, THE THIS **WEAPON** and S.O.S MUTANT FROM THE STARS a new Beastmaster novel - BEASTMASTER'S ARK from Andre Norton and Lyn McConchie will appear in hardcover from Tor in June I've been rather surprised by the rave reviews Anne Rice has been giving the new books by

Alice Borchardt over the past couple of years. She doesn't usually give her name to 'blurb raves'. While watching a programme on Anne Rice on the Biography Channel recently, I discovered that Alice Borchardt thinks a hell of a lot about Anne Rice. Apparently she's her sister.... Ooops.
