However, last Monday the committee voted in favour of the Ivy Bush, which is managed by one of the BSFG's founder members, Ray Bradbury.



March 22 titles from Futura: NIGHTWATCH and THE WALL OF YEARS by Andy Stephenson; LIFEBOAT by Harry Harrison and Gordon R. Dickson; UFOs PAST, PRESENT AND

FUTURE, 'fact' by Robert Emenegger : PRINCE OF ANNWN, CHILDREN OF LLYR. SONG OF RHIANNON and ISLAND OF THE MIGHTY by Evangeline Walton.. The second half of Tanith Lee's sequel to THE BIRTH-GRAVE (the first half being SHADOWFIRE, in Futura's February 22 print) will be out in the Autumn. The Glen A. Larson / Robert Thurston adaptation of BATTLESTAR: GALACTICA (see MEDIA NEWS) is itself being adapted - for THE WEEKLY NEWS, beginning in the March 3 issue. At this rate, it'll take about 3 - 4 weeks ...

The TV pilot for the US television series BATTLESTAR: GALACTICA will get a British theatrical release at Easter.

Brian Lewis: "R2D2" and "Princess" (from Astron 1).


Steven J. Green: "Darth Vader", "Cylon", "Judge Dredd", "Cylon Attack" and layouts.

Television executive Steve Gentry, 37, killed with tv director Bruce Geller, when their plane crashed in Bueno Vista Canvon, near Santa Barbara.

Gentry, formerly involved with STARSKY AND HUTCH and CHARLIE'S ANGELS, was currently at MCA on the BATTLESTAR: GALACTICA production team. Geller was best known for work in the 60s

MISSION: IMPOSSIBLE series, which shot SPACE: 1999 leads Martin Landau and Barbara Bain to tv stardom.

THE RED DEATH appears to have fallen through.. Likewise Paul Bartel's FRANKENCAR - he's off in Berlin with the \$2.5 million HORRIFIC MOVIE HOUSE MASACRE. . But not every project is off -John (ZARDOZ) Boorman's MERLIN is now in production.. Margot (SUPERMAN) Kidder and James (CAPRICORN ONE) Brolin will star in the 'true' story of supernatural terror in Long Island, THR AMITYVILLE HORROR, based upon Jay Anson's best-seller.. Harry Alan Towers' new CTV series THE SHAPE OF THINGS TO COME will feature Jack Palance, Carol Lynley, John Ireland - and a very large budget. Joining these 'stars' are Nicholas Campbell and Koo (SHABBY TIGER) Stark, who accompanies John Stears's latest creation, robot dog Sparky, on trips across a devastated Earth. Yawn.. Harlan Ellison is suing ABC-TV and Paramount Pictures (still hard at work on the STAR TREK movie) over the Ernest Borgnine series FUTURE COP (a jazzed-up HOLMES & YOYO), which he alleges was based upon a story he wrote in 1970 with Ben Bova (BRILLO) - the show's just been axed.. The Brian De Palma / Frank Yablans project DEMOLISHED MAN (remember ?) seems to be shelved again : Yablans is working with Michael (WESTWORLD) Crichton on two new movies, while De Palma is directing HOME MOVIES, a "personal" film.. PARADISE LOST of ? Sure, according to Cliver (FORCE TEN FROM NAVARONE) Unger, who's producing the new adaptation. Unger is looking for "the perfect Adam and Eve" for John Collier's doubtful screenplay. In case you're wondering, that sound you can hear is probably Milton rotating in his grave.. Soon from Italy: THE FISH MEN, with Joseph Cotton, Barbara (HUMANOID) Bach and Richard Johnson.. The 213 million disaster pic METEOR, with Sean Connery and Natalie Wood, is to have another \$12 million added to its budget for extra special effects work.. Meanwhile, sfx genius John Dykstra is handling the effects work for Paddy (NETWORK) Chayefsky's ALTERED STATES with the rest of the Apogee Inc. crowd : fellow member Douglas Trumbull is also hard at work on a new screen process at his own Future General company .. Forthcoming: Thames TV's re-vamped QUATERMASS, with John Mills and Barbara (1990) Kellerman.. The afore-mentioned SPACEMAN AND KING ARTHUR, with Dennis (RICHIE BROCKELMAN)

Gil (AIRPORT '77) Gerard in Glen (BATTLESTAR: GALACTICA) Larson's \$12 million production of BUCK ROGERS IN THE 25th CENTURY - three two-hour television movies.. Joseph Brenner's SHOCK WAVES, with veterans John Carradine and Peter Cushing ...
