BOOK REVIEWS

THE FADED SUN: KESRITH by C.J.Cherryh, DAW Books 1978, \$1.95, 252 pages. Reviewed by Pauline E.Morgan.

There are three intelligent species in this version of the universe, humans and the humanoid regul and mri. All three are implausibly portrayed---full of contradictions and incongruous in their behaviour. The regul (dominant species until their recent defeat by the humans) are colonists and merchants. For a race whose language lacks the words for "courage" and "imagination" they have done remarkably well to invent space travel and colonise hostile worlds. The adult regul are so fat as to require machines in order to move around. They are said to be incapable of killing in cold blood yet will slaughter their young for minor infringements. With all the advantages of technology they are unable to tell the sex of their young before puberty.

The mri are more imaginative, yet have allowed themselves to be almost wiped out. Their warrior caste acts as mercenaries for the regul. The humans---newcomers to the interstellar arena---seem politically naive.

After 43 years of human-regul warfare the regul concede defeat and transfer control of a few planets to the humans, including Kesrith, the "homeworld" of the mri. So much can be gathered by wading through the first hundred pages, up to the waist in a terminology intended to make the mri alien. Yet it takes more than strange words to make a race alien, and much less, like the absence of a glossary, to alienate the reader. The plot keeps a low profile until half-way through, when it weakly raises its head. Ms Cherryh has tried to make this a political novel, but she lacks the skill of, say, Allen Drury, and fails to be convincing. Most confusing is the lack of time scales. Although the impression is given that Kesrith has been the mri homeworld for centuries the reader is eventually told that they have only been there for the duration of the war.

Having finished the book you are left with a vivid afterimage of Kesrith----a wild, hostile planet, full of unseen pitfalls. The only real aliens in the book are the indigenous lie-forms of Kesrith, including the bearlike dusei which appear capable of forming telepathic bonds with the mri. Perhaps it was for Kesrith itself that the book was nominated for a Hugo. Ms Cherryh promises better things to come. P.E.M.

THE TELEVISION APOLLO ANNIVERSARY PROGRAMMES. The difference in treatment between the BBC and ITV documentaries was rather typical of these opposing channels (writes Dave Hardy). While the BBC treated the subject seriously and, especially in the second part on BBC-2, in depth, with a probing look by James Burke at the <u>real</u> facts behind the US Moon-landing programme, ITV's effort was decidedly superficial. Producer Tony Palmer apparently had access to a tremendous amount of beautiful visual material from NASA, which he strung together with no regard for chronological or any other sequence. Images from one flight were linked with craft-to-Earth communication sounds from another, and Apollo, Skylab, Soyuz and even Gemini film hopelessly intermingled, all with background music from Mike Oldfield's <u>Incantations</u>. However, all the programmes are preserved by the Group for posterity on VHS video cassettes, and members who wish to judge them for themselves can do so by arrangement.
