Sonetime late in 1948 or early in 49, one Williain H. Evens started attending meetings of the Tasingion Science Fiction issociation. Sometime late in 1949 or early in 50 it occured to me that I would be getting in FAPA before lowg, and should have some project to krep me busy and to give me something to telk about in FAPA. Reneabering thet Bill had once been in the outfit, I asked him for suggestions, Ee sugsested the Check-List, and after about two months of herning and hawing. I decided that it might not be such a bad idea, Finally I wrote to RDSwisher, getting back the following reply:

21 May 1950
Dear Bob:

1. Yes, you may use the information in the checklist as you wish.
2. I have almost a foot of $3 x 5$ index cards representing the cumalative 1929~1944 list as described in the enclosed quotations. Iill be glad to send then to you as soon as I get a chance to pack then and take thern to the express office if you'll asree to tale care of them and retum them to me if you dori't use them.
3. I'll be glad to give what help I can in untengling confusionse

I am enclasing a list of titles on winich information was incomplete at the time I gave up. ... Eiegards to Bill Evans.
