VAN VOGT IS GOH AT CHATTACON. The ChattaCon committee has announced author A. E. Van Vogt will be Guest of Honor at ChattaCon 3, the weekend of Jan. 6-8, 1978, in Chattanooga. Van Vogt, the author of Slan, The Silkie, and other SF classics, joins Arsen Darnay and Perry Chapdelaine as invited guests at the convention, with Darnay serving as Master of Ceremonies. Originally, Van Vogt was to be GoH at the proposed DixieCon78 Deep South Convention next year, but when the bid lost, Van Vogt was re-invited for ChattaCon instead. HUGO AWARDS ANNOUNCED. The Hugo Awards were announced at SunCon, the 35th annual World SF Convention. The Hugos are given for achievement in Science Fiction during the preceding calendar year, and are voted upon by the membership of the convention. The awards were as follows: Best Novel-Where Late the Sweet Birds Sang, by Kate Wilhelm; Best Novella-(tie) By Any Other Name, by Spider Robinson; Houston, Houston, Do You Read? by James Tiptree, Jr.; Best Novelette-The Bicentennial Man, by Isaac Asimov; Best Short Story-Tricentennial, by Joe Haldeman; Best Dramatic Presentation-No Award; Best Professional Artist-Rick Sternbach; Best Professional Editor-Ben Bova (ANALOG); Best Fanzine-SCIENCE FICTION REVIEW; Best Fan Writer-(tie) Dick Geis, Susan Wood; Best Fan Artist-Phil Foglio. The John W. Campbell Award for the best new pro writer went to C. J. Cherryh. The Fantasy Grand Master Award, the Gandalf Award, was given to Andre Norton. Next year's WorldCon will be in Phoenix, Ariz. (IguanaCon). NWL

CHATTACON SEEKS AMATEUR ART. ChattaCon Chairman Irvin Koch has issued a request to southeastern S.F. fan artists for works to display in the ChattaCon 3 art show, and is willing to pay return shipment for artwork not sold. According to Koch, artists not planning to attend ChattaCon 3 should send up to three small drawings or paintings to Dick Lynch (see address at masthead). Each piece must be priced at \$ 20 or less and be mat framed only. A commission of 15% of all sales will go to the convention. All pieces will be put up for auction, so artists should only send what they feel will sell. The convention will pay what Koch says is "a reasonable amount" for return shipment of unsold works. RL

DIRECTIONS TO U.T.C. FOR OUT-OF-TOWNERS. Take Interstate Spur I-124 to 4th St. Exit (last exit before bridge over Tennessee River). Go on 4th St. about 7/10 mile to Houston St. (10th intersection), turn right on Houston. Continue on Houston two blocks to Vine St. and turn LEFT on Vine (Vine is one-way). Go  $2\frac{1}{2}$  blocks. Student Center is on LEFT (as is parking) side of Vine St.; look for its sign in front of the building. The meeting room is on the first floor, on the left and past the main desk. RL
