RAY PALMER DIES....Ray Palmer, former editor of Amazing and several other SF magazines, died on August 15, in Tallahassee, Florida at age 67, following a stroke. Palmer edited Amazing from 1938, when the magazine was bought by Ziff-Davis, until 1949. He was credited with uplifting <u>Amazing</u> from a garish pulp to a more respectable SF magazine. DL

MORE OBITUARIES....Word comes to us of the deaths of two prominent people in the field of Astronomy.

Stephen A. Walther, founder and publisher of <u>Astronomy</u> magazine, died of a brain tumor at age 32, in Milwaukee. The magazine recently reached its 50th issue, and is significant in its presentation of pictorial astronomy by means of photographs and marvelous astronomical paintings; it will continue.

H. A. Rey, author of the beginning astronomy books, <u>The Stars-A New Way to</u> <u>See Them and Find the Constellations</u>, died of natural causes at age 86, in <u>Cambridge</u>, Mass. This writer's interest in astronomy was fostered by these books way back in grade school. DL

ODDS & ENDS....Ziff-Davis Gorporation, former publishers of Amazing and Fantastic SF magazines, has purchased WRCB-TV, Channel 3 in Chattanooga. Spider Robinson has resigned as book reviewer of Galaxy magazine, as related by Locus, the national SF newspaper. Robinson was upset by editorial revisions and late payments.
