None of the people I've mentioned for the "general" awards have won Hugos before, and all deserve award recognition. It's a personal crusade of mine to open the Hugos – so long a closed circle – and honor deserving folks who have not already made that happy march to the podium. I hope you'll join me. Spread the wealth – name nominees for whom the Hugo will mean the most.

In the "Best Related Book" category, I've already listed *Julius Schwartz's* magnificent autobiography, **Man of Two Worlds**. Publication of this gem gives fandom the chance to honor the founder of fanzines and the father of the Silver Age of super-heroes for the first time with our ultimate bauble. In the categories honoring specific fictional works, Mike Resnick's "Elephants of Neptune" was a stand-out short story in **Asimov's**, and in the dramatic category, I cheer for **Crouching Tiger**, **Hidden Dragon** along with **The X-Men** and **Frequency** ... but I beg *you* to name other quality items.

Semi-finally, a sad announcement – **Challenger**'s website has been erased from the Net, through no fault either of mine or of Richard Brandt's, the generous soul who has been handling this increasingly important outlet for me.
