


# THE SEVEN STATISTICIANS

It is published by Bywater Press at 3243 165th Ave, SE, Bellevue, Washington 98008. The text of *The Seven Statisticians (Shichinin no Tousotsujin)* was composed using the TeX typesetting system, and is set in 10-and-11-point Optima. The original press run of this publication was printed 1 October 2001, and was reproduced by the Xerographic process, on an actually Xerox copier, which accounts for its quality, or lack thereof.

The front and back cover illustrations are a poster and a still from Akira Kurosawa's masterpiece *The Seven Samurai* collected from the web.
