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*** JOHN KESSEL WILL BE HONORED AT UNPRECEDENTED TIPTREE AWARD CEREMONY AT WISCON!

The James Tiptree, Jr. Award will present \$1000 in prize money to John Kessel for his novella, "Stories for Men" at Wiscon 27, on May 25, 2003. Kessel won the 2002 award with M. John Harrison, whose novel LIGHT has already been honored at the first 2002 Tiptree Ceremony at Seacon in Hinckley, England, on April 18. Since John Kessel was unable to attend that ceremony, he will receive the award in an unprecedented second Tiptree ceremony. Kessel will also receive a fabric cake created by artist Zhenne Wood. Prevented from attending the April 18 ceremony in England by his teaching schedule, John Kessel missed receiving his award there. He also missed the amazing spectacle of Mike Harrison transformed into a mythic king when he was crowned with the Tiptree tiara and his stunned-but-delighted expression as he was serenaded by the Tiptree chorus. The Tiptree motherboard decided to produce another ceremony at this year's WisCon in order that John Kessel too could be crowned, serenaded, and feted for his Tiptree-winning work. Happily, that means that WisCon will NOT be denied a Tiptree ceremony at this year's convention. The ceremony will take place directly following the Guest of Honor speeches on Sunday night.

CONFUSION ABOUT CONCOURSE HOTEL RATES

There has been some confusion among Concourse hotel registration staff. Since filling WisCon's room block in early April, a few rooms have become available as they have been released from other small room blocks. Some WisCon attendees who have been lucky enough to snap up these rooms have been told by registration staff that they will be billed at a higher rate than WisCon's negotiated rate. In fact, all rooms reserved before the official cut-off date for WisCon's room block (May 5, 2003) should be charged at the WisCon negotiated rate of \$89 for regular rooms or \$114 for Governor's Club rooms.

If you have been told that your room will be charged at a higher rate, please call the Concourse and ask that your room be charged at the WisCon rate. If you have any problems, please contact Scott Custis through the WisCon email list.

Rates WILL INCREASE, however, after the May 5 deadline. So, if any rooms are released by the hotel from some of the other room blocks after this date, they will be released at a higher rate than WisCon's negotiated rate. We will not be able to help you get a lower rate after that cut-off date.

Carol Emshwiller won the 2002 Philip K. Dick award for her novel, THE MOUNT. The Philip K. Dick Award is presented annually for distinguished science fiction published in paperback original form in the United States. The award is sponsored by the Philadelphia Science Fiction Society and announced at Norwescon 26 at SeaTac, Washington on April 18, 2003. 2002 judges were Shelley Rodrigo Blanchard, Michael Blumlein, Nalo Hopkinson (chair), Donna McMahon, and Lois Tilton.

In addition, WisCon's OTHER guest of honor, China Miéville, received a special citation from the Philip K. Dick judges for his novel THE SCAR.

The Nebula Awards are administered, voted and presented by the Science Fiction Writers of America (SFWA) to acknowledge excellence in science fiction writing. The 2002 Nebulas were awarded on Saturday, April 19, 2003 in Philadelphia, PA. Notably, all the winners have significant WisCon connections,

with the possible exception of Neil Gaiman and LORD OF THE RINGS screenwriters. Here are the winners--

Novel: AMERICAN GODS by Neil Gaiman (Morrow). We think Neil likes WisCon.

Novella: "Bronte's Egg" by Richard Chwedyk (F&F). Richard is a regular WisCon attendee and program participant; he will attend WisCon 27.

Novelettes: "Hell is the Absence of God" by Ted Chiang (STARLIGHT 3). Ted is also a frequent WisCon attendee. He will be reading at WisCon 27.

Short Story: "Creature" by Carol Emshwiller (F&SF). Carol, of course, is WisCon 27's Guest of Honor.

Script: LORD OF THE RINGS: THE FELLOWSHIP OF THE RING by Frances Walsh, Phillipa Boyens and Peter Jackson (New Line). We think WisCon attendees like the LORD OF THE RINGS films.

Grand Master: Ursula K. Le Guin. Ursula was the Guest of Honor at WisCon 20 and will be attending WisCon 27.

Author Emeritus: Katherine MacLean. Katherine was WisCon's very first Guest of Honor at WisCon 1 in 1977.
