Special Wartime Issue #07

Dear Readers:

More than 185 days have passed, and Israeli soldiers are still fighting (and unfortunately falling), to keep Israeli citizens safe from the hands of the Hamas terrorist government in Gaza. The Hamas started the war, gleefully killing 1200 Israelis and many non-Israelis as well. In addition to the mayhem and brutal assault, torturing, raping, etc., they took over 250 hostages: women, children (babies), and others. AND THE HAMAS HAVE PROMISED MORE OF THE SAME!

Apparently, this is the <u>Hebrew version</u> of the article "*The Universe is a Dark Forest*" [my translation] by Nick Richardson, about Liu Cixin's 2008 Hugo Award winning novel (2015) "*The Three-Body Problem*".

I haven't yet tracked down the English original of Richardson's writeup – so I'll try getting through the Hebrew and will get back to you and our readers with my comments on the article. I'll also try to get my hands on the book, or at least the TV version (8-episodes in season 1).

TV Review: Raised by Wolves Season 1 (2020)

I only got through the first 3 episodes – having wanted to quit after the first. The storyline is convoluted and much of the background is unclear.

There are some great special effects, though. The main character, '**Mother'** – the android – is very scary (first 2 episodes directed by Ridley Scott of '*Alien'* fame) and may give you nightmares.

I wouldn't recommend this TV series, but I only saw 3 out of 10 episodes. Apparently, there is a 2nd season that "*has received critical acclaim*" (see:

Movie Review: The Shift (2017/2023)

The story is about the multiverse (the existence of multiple dimensions, with multiple versions of ourselves – as applicable) and about Faith and Good and Evil. A man (Kevin Garner – played by Kristoffer Poloha) has a car accident and is helped by a stranger who calls himself 'the Benefactor' (excellently played by Neal McDonough). The Benefactor manages an infinite number of the multiverse people who work for him. They are NOT good people and cause chaos in the world – basically, spreading 'Evil'.

He, as well as his minions, have a bracelet with which they can shift themselves or others, from one parallel world to another – often as a punishment. He has come to Garner's world, to recruit that dimension's version of him. <u>He then</u> <u>shifts him out of his world into a different one</u>. Only Garner refuses to cooperate, and instead begins to pray to God – causing the enraged Benefactor to disappear. This had never happened with any of the other versions of Garner – they had all let temptation and greed overcome any goodness in them.

However, even though the Benefactor has disappeared, bad things are still happening around the world that Garner now finds himself in.



To make a long story short – even though the world Garner now inhabits is in economic and social deterioration, his Faith keeps him strong, and he tries at every opportunity to help others. Eventually the Benefactor returns and there is a confrontation between him and Garner. Who will win: Good or Evil?

The movie, written and directed by Brock Heasley is based on clear Judeo-Christian values – similar to the story of Job in the Bible. It is a story of Faith. Not everyone will enjoy it – though I appreciated it, and it has some good actors/acting.

As I was doing some background research on the story, I discovered that in 2017, a short 22-minute film was made by Heasly – apparently, as a promo to get funding for the full movie. This can be seen for free on Youtube. In the short version, the Benefactor is called out by his real name: Satan. It covers the first chapter of the movie.

Heasly has taken Christian faith (the eternal war between Good and Evil) into the world of SF (the shifting between multiverses) and – I personally enjoyed the storyline, although in Judaism 'Good' and 'Evil' have some slightly different connotations than in Christianity.

TV Review: LOKI Seasons 1&2 (2023)

Loki is the **Norse God of Mischief** (remember this – there is a test at the end \bigcirc) and a key character in the Marvel Universe. In the comics, his mischief led to the formation of the Avengers. In the movies, he's also caused plenty of mischief and damage. He is mostly depicted as an adversary (even a negative reflection) of his brother Thor (actually Thor's father Odin – the head of the Norse Gods – had adopted Loki).

The storyline in both Season 1 and Season 2 of the TV series is about multiple dimensions (the multiverse) <u>AND</u> time travel. Two for the price of one. The time travel aspect is an offshoot of the multiverse (or vice-versa). In the Marvel Universe, there is an organization called the Time Variance Authority (TVA) that manipulates, controls, and manages time travel and the multiverse to keep it stable.

The TVA is NOT a nice organization, and often carries out its work by taking draconian measures to 'fix' what it deems to be a problem (or potential issue that needs to be 'nipped in the bud').

As far as the Loki series is concerned – it's a very convoluted series of episodes that are often difficult to understand and connect to get the 'big picture'. If you manage to get to the end of the second season, it sort of all falls together – but it's a great mess getting there.

The acting is mostly good (Tom Hiddleston as Loki is good, as are the other cast members), but I don't understand the original concept of having Loki – a Norse God – play a part in all of this. Marvel could have taken just about any character in the Marvel Universe, to play the lead (some names that come to mind: Hulk, She-Hulk, Thing, an X-Man ...). I can't think of any reason that Loki should have been selected for the main role in this TVA storyline, as opposed to anyone else – even a non-super powered individual...

The character of Loki in the Marvel Universe is **almost always a negative force** – at his worst, he plots and carries out evil schemes, and at his 'best', he is a master mischief maker seeding confusion and chaos for shortsighted gain or just for the fun of it.

The Loki in the TV series almost never uses his magic powers (he is a very powerful sorcerer/god) and plays the 'good guy' throughout (except for some of his own variants from other dimensions).



I'm in a dilemma of whether to recommend the show or not. The acting is quite good, the main ideas are good ... but it's one big mess that the viewer needs to plod through, to get at the key takeaways.
