It's up to Lesleigh to plan her own trip, of course. However, some brief checking with the Thomas Cook & Son travel agency indicates that there is a 14-to-28-day excursion air fare for a Los Angeles-to-Sydney round trip costing \$833. It's necessary because of time zone changes to leave Los Angeles on Wednesday, August 9th to arrive in Sydney on Friday, August 11th, the beginning of the SynCon. The 28-day limit will allow Lesleigh enough time to arrive in Sydney a day or two before the SynCon begins, spend almost three weeks after the convention visiting fans and touring, and return to Los Angeles just in time for the beginning of the L.A.Con. A round-trip air fare from Columbia (or St. Louis, probably Lesleigh's point of departure) to Los Angeles will cost roughly \$200 more. Train or automobile expenses have not been estimated, nor have other travel expenses such as food, hotel accomodations, and so on because it's not known to what extent Lesleigh will be touring while in Australia or to what extent she'll be the guest of fans instead of paying her own way. In general, the Fund's total of \$1,060 should be large enough to make its original purpose, that of bringing a foreign fan to Australia's 1972 national s-f convention, possible. The Down Under Fan Fund may therefore be termed a success!
